Kim was co-opted onto Whitworth Town Council in April 2025. She has lived in Whitworth for over 35 years and has raised her three children here.



CUBS

On Tuesday, April 1, the Whitworth Cubs met to create a hedge from logs accumulating in the Memorial Gardens. The aim was to create a suitable habitat for small birds, mammals and invertebrates.

First, the Cubs gathered sticks, branches and prunings deliberately left in the gardens by RBC's Green Space workers. They then knocked sharpened poles into the ground before selecting branches to interweave horizontally between the poles.

They learnt that the wood and leaves will die back creating a cosy and safe place for the creatures to shelter.

The whole experience was fun, lively and well-managed by the Cub leaders and Steve Haigh who had prepared the resources in advance and who encouraged the Cubs to understand the nature of the task and respond accordingly.



TOMMY TUMBLE TOWN

Tommy Tumble Town is a role play centre for children aged between 0 and 8 years old and was opened in memory of Charlotte and Dan Squibbs' son Tommy who sadly passed away from leukaemia in March 2024. The family wanted to create a legacy for Tommy and are receiving a great deal of comfort knowing that his name will be on the tip of people's tongues for ever more.



The role play centre allows children to pretend to be various people including firefighters, hairdressers, builders, opticians and gardeners. It is an inclusive venue where all children can attend, and parents can meet likeminded parents and form friendships with people they previously did not know. They have a focus on communication, including non-verbal communication and use Makaton and provide sign language lessons. They hope to provide the local area with something they know is missing and very much needed. Ellie Clegg, a year 5 pupil at Tonacliffe School, has followed on from her success in the summer, when she won the GB Dry-Slope skiing championship, by heading back out to the Alps this winter.

In January she travelled to Champery in Switzerland where, in weather conditions that would have been more familiar in Whitworth – heavy rain and sleet – she achieved 4th in the Giant Slalom and 6th in the Slalom events.

A few weeks later she returned to Pila in Italy where the previous year she had managed to podium in both disciplines in the National Schools Snowsports championships. This would be her last outing in the under-10 age group before stepping up to the under-12s in the spring. Determined to go out on a high, Ellie did herself proud: in both races she took first place, crowning her Overall NSSA champion for her age-group.

CUBICO'S SCOUT MOOR 2 WIND FARM PROPOSAL

It can't have escaped your attention that a proposal has been put forward for Scout Moor 2, an extension of the Scout Moor Wind farm, on the moors above Whitworth.

To read in detail about the proposals, please visit scoutmoor2.co.uk for information on the location and height of the turbines and the proposed measures that Cubico, the company proposing the project, will be taking to counteract any damage caused in their installation, should planning permission be granted for the wind farm.

A group of local residents have come together to form "Say No to Scout Moor 2", concerned about the damage to the moorland, the visual effects of the tall turbines (together with associated noise and shadow flicker) plus the damage the project will have on local flora and fauna.

SCHOOL UNIFORM PROJECT



What is peat?

Peat is a soil type formed when plants die in wet and often acid conditions. In these conditions, plant material gets compressed but doesn't decompose.

They are the largest natural terrestrial carbon store with more than twice the carbon stored in all the world's forests... and four times as much as in the atmosphere.

WHITWORTH MUSEUM

Coach Travel - In the days before foreign travel became commonplace, Whitworth residents would often take a motor coach tour for their annual holiday. The south coast was popular with resorts such as Torquay, Bournemouth and Ilfracombe being particularly so with Whitworth and Rochdale residents.

During the travel boom which followed the end of WW2, many booked holidays with the well established Yelloway Motor Services in Rochdale whose distinctive bright yellow liveried coaches were a common sight in Whitworth. A number of the local shops along the length of Market Street held booking agencies. Others used the local coach operator, Charles Holt & Son, based at Sunnyside Garage here in Whitworth. Holt's, a small company compared with Yelloway, was well known for the smart appearance of its coaches, none being smarter than the Bedford SB based Thomas Harrington Ltd, 'Europa' which, in 1959, took a party of Whitworth holidaymakers to the Scottish town of Dunoon. Over the years Holt's operated a number of Harrington bodied coaches including the Art Deco influenced 'Dorsal', a relatively ordinary coach from the 1930's but fitted with a large dorsal fin at the rear.

MAYOR'S OVERVIEW

I have had a fantastic year as your Mayor and thoroughly enjoyed representing our Town. I have been very busy and have met some lovely people and have enjoyed attending the many events that I have been invited to. I would like to thank everyone who has supported me by attending or giving raffle prizes and donations for my fundraising events this year. We have certainly been busy and should have managed to raise a good amount, to give out to our local charities and community groups.

I couldn't have done it without the support of my wife & Mayoress and our local councillors so would like to thank them all for what they have done this year. I can honestly say I have learned a lot this year and enjoyed representing you – the great people of Whitworth. I will continue to support you all I can as a Town Councillor.

INITIATIVES

The Council is supported by **Town Clerk** Rachel Hodson, who works 30 hours a week as standard. The Council employs a **Parish Lengthsman**, Chris Rothwell, for general repairs and maintenance, including attending to Public Rights of Way, mending footpaths, fences and stiles and undertaking a multitude of jobs in and around the town. The Council also employs a full-time **Town Caretaker** position which is funded in part by Rossendale Borough Council. Glen Iliff, our Town Caretaker, litter-picks targeted sites the length and breadth of the town, and reports issues and problems to the Clerk. All three maintain healthy attendance sheets – a testament to their professionalism and commitment to the town.

The Town Council's **website**, www.whitworth.gov.uk, is well used and an asset to the Council. The site aims to be a one-stop-shop for Whitworth information for residents and visitors and is updated by the Town Clerk.

This year **Whitworth in Bloom** have racked up many hours preparing the various beds, boxes and baskets that they manage. Their areas include Healey Corner, Whitworth Library and the beds in front of Whitworth Medical Centre and the Co-op. They also continued to keep up a great job looking after the parks and areas around The Bug, Cowm Park Way North, the Fudge Factory, the Cemetery, Whitworth Memorial Gardens and at Britannia. They have also decorated around Whitworth ready for VE Day, re-spraying the bicycle at Britannia. Red, white and blue flowers have also been planted at the Tonacliffe banner frame site.

The Town Council-produced quarterly **Whitworth Valley News** magazine continues to be a very popular read, receiving editorial contributions from a wide variety of organisations and featuring 29 paying advertisers. It involves a significant amount of work for the Clerk but is very well received and ensures all in Whitworth are up to date with town news and developments. It is hand-delivered to all households by volunteers on behalf of the Sports Council.

The Town Council contributes towards the fight against crime with the continued sponsorship of the **Whitworth community police car**, which has proved invaluable to the local constabulary. This has been made possible by generous sponsorship towards the cost provided by **RRG Toyota Rochdale**.

The Town Council works in partnership with Rossendale and Lancashire Councils and other local organisations including Lancashire Police and Together Housing to provide the best possible services for the Whitworth community. To give examples, the Town Council facilitates monthly Multi-Agency meetings, where representatives of all the main agencies come together to tackle issues in the town. The Town Council continues to take a pro-active approach to tackling the issue of litter and uncollected dog-mess, supporting the legislative work undertaken by the Borough Council, and supporting volunteers by providing litter picking equipment.

The Town Council's **Tourism and Leisure Committee**, featuring councillor and non-councillor members, organises or part-organises many events annually – this past year's offers include the Rushcart, a Christmas craft workshop, First Aid courses, Santa Express and the New Year's Duck Race. Additionally, the Town Council itself is responsible for organising Whitworth's Remembrance Sunday commemorations and the Community Carol Service. All these events serve to preserve and strengthen the town's identity and provide a solid sense of community and civic pride.

Comprising town councillors and representatives of local sporting organisations, the **Whitworth Sports Council** continues to flourish, and plans for the 2025 annual Skyline walk are well under way.

TOWN TWINNING

Whitworth has been twinned with Kandel since 1966 and the friendship between the towns continues. Cllr Aldred and the rest of the committee are instrumental in keeping the twinning alive, and thanks are due to them for their continued work; if you wish to get involved with Town Twinning in Whitworth, please contact secretary/treasurer Steven Mitchell at sjmitch2609@ hotmail.co.uk. A delegation from Kandel will visit Whitworth in September this year and Whitworth Town Council hope that all the delegation enjoy their visit there.

The quality of the council is monitored and ratified through the benchmark council awards scheme, and the feedback from the community is overwhelmingly positive.
