The Whitworth Rushcart is one of only four such celebrations which still take place in the United Kingdom. Whitworth's cart is unique in that it is the only one to be

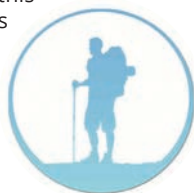

At 9.30pm that same day, a commemorative beacon was lit at the top of Brown Wardle, alongside other beacons across France and the United Kingdom as part of the International Tribute.

On Sunday 11th May, our Tourism and Leisure Committee hosted an extremely popular 80th anniversary celebratory event which also featured entertainment from Whitworth's own national champions, Whitworth Vale and Healey Brass Band, as well as Whitworth Community Choir, u3a's incredible ukelele band and Rossendale Drum Majorettes. CHRISTMAS CRAFT EXTRAVAGANZA!



Whitworth Town Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee have been getting in the Christmas spirit planning the Christmas Celebrations. Following the success of previous years' workshops, the volunteers have decided to do it all again!

The original wreath making idea was the brainchild of volunteer member Linda Parker to recycle the Christmas tree offcuts the group produce. The event takes place on Saturday 6th December at The Ashcroft from 10am until 3.30pm. Crafters can choose between learning the art of Ukrainian egg decorating (£10pp) or making their own Christmas crackers (£5pp) from 10am until 12pm and there will be the now-traditional wreath-making workshop (£20pp) from 1pm until 3:30pm.

Everything will be provided to make a Ukrainian decorated egg, and attendees can personalise their Christmas crackers by bringing their own gifts for inside the crackers if they wish. Traditional, natural materials will be provided for the wreaths, although attendees are welcome to bring along decorations to customise their wreaths to their own colour scheme. Guests will receive tea, coffee, juice and a mince pie and be entertained by Christmas tunes while they craft. The bar will also be open for those wanting to enjoy some traditional mulled wine or speciality coffee.

Places are limited so book now to avoid disappointment! Please note that the Christmas cracker making is suitable from those aged 5 and above and Ukrainian egg decorating for those aged 12 and above. All under 16s will need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.

CHRISTMAS TREES ON BRACKETS



Whitworth's Tourism and Leisure Committee (TLC) are aiming to continue to extend the Christmas lights offer across the length of the town by installing Christmas trees to properties around Whitworth.

To spread the festive cheer throughout the town, the Committee are hoping that residents might consider displaying a Christmas tree on their property. The Committee can offer a 3ft to 4ft real Christmas tree plus a set of mains-powered festive lights either multi coloured or white, including installation and removal. We anticipate the cost will be £50 per tree and the trees will be installed in the last two weeks of November and will be taken away at the end of the festive season. The contractor will need to arrange access for the mains cable to be fed into the house for installation. If you want a Christmas tree but do not have a bracket, the TLC can supply one fitted for £25. There is a very limited supply of these which are sold strictly on a first come, first served basis.

SANTA CLAUS IS COMING TO TOWN

Once again, the TLC have arranged for Father Christmas to take some time out from his very busy schedule to visit Whitworth and district in December. He will be sledding through the town in his custom-built 4-wheel drive sleigh on Saturday the 13th and Sunday the 14th of December, between 6 and 8pm.



His main route will be between Healey and Britannia. Due to the good behaviour of the boys and girls last year at Bacup Town Centre, the committee has agreed to make this extra stop once again. Santa will be calling at most of the residential areas of Whitworth as he travels around, driving slowly to allow families to wave as he passes by. It would be impossible to cover every single street, but the volunteers have worked hard to ensure that you won't have far to go to see him drive by.

Residents are encouraged to come out and meet Father Christmas as he makes short stops at allocated points and Santa's helpers will be handing out sweets at the allocated stops. It was amazing that these children could recall lots of peat facts when the Mayor asked what they knew about peat. During the presentations in school, children learned that peat is an irreplaceable, non-renewable resource and local peatlands are some of the deepest and most valuable national assets. Our globally rare blanket bogs play a vital role in protecting Whitworth's communities and contribute to a healthier and more resilient environment by:



- improving flood resilience and water quality
- capturing and storing carbon
- having cooling effects on the climate by storing carbon and reflecting solar radiation naturally
- supporting and improving biodiversity, including many endangered species
- recording the past over millennia
- improving mental and physical health and wellbeing
- other economic benefits linked with eco-tourism

Every primary schoolchild in Whitworth also received a peat sticker as a memento and all agreed that peat was like a superhero protecting our planet.

WHITWORTH COMMUNITY GALLERIES

Whitworth Community Galleries have had something of a reboot this year, with a more permanent relocation into two of the corridors at the Leisure Centre supplementing arrangements at the Library.

The idea of the Galleries is to provide spaces for local individuals and community organisations to exhibit, providing over the months and years a rolling picture of various aspects of Whitworth life. The galleries sometimes house photography, sometimes artwork. They might

- record a local event (eg Rushcart, the rebuilding of the High School)
- celebrate achievement (eg school artwork, a club's significant anniversary) or success (reopening the Leisure Centre)
- present a simple display of beautiful work (individual or group artistry or photography)
- show off what an organisation does (eg U3A, Museum, Stronger Together Carers)
- help to recruit new members (eg Over the Tops walking group)
- advertise an upcoming annual event (eg Skyline)
- ... or, very often, be a mix of those things.

Lots of things in Whitworth are done for love. Not all of those things are appropriate for display – but, as the list above implies, a lot is. LIGHTHOUSE COMMUNITY FOODSHARE

Artwork created by high school students has been turned into thank you cards which will be distributed by a food project. The Lighthouse Community Foodshare in Whitworth organised a competition with Art Teacher Mrs Walsh from Whitworth Community High School. Students from Year 7 to 9 were invited to submit pictures which had to include key items, like a lighthouse and also to reflect the seasons of Spring and Summer. Around 200 students took part and four of the designs were being picked as the best and made into cards.

Co-founder of The Lighthouse Steve Gough attended school to present Anastassia Matel, 12, Mahnoor Fatima, 12, Lucia Clarke, 12 and Alfie Howard, 14, with their finished cards.

Steve explained the history of the Lighthouse Foodshare, which launched in 2020, and how it works, and he also told the students their cards would be seen by people all over the country, as The Lighthouse supporters are not just local residents. He said: "We set up and within three weeks we had opened a shop and were helping more than 300 people."

The Lighthouse does not just provide food; it also offers school uniforms and electrical items and also signposts people who need additional help.

As a thank you to everyone who supports the charity in whatever way, cards are sent out, and now those cards have designs which were created by the students.

Art teacher Mrs Walsh was proud of the students' achievements and said: "I think they have done a beautiful job. We had so many designs to choose from - about 200 - and we came up with a shortlist of seven, with four being picked as winners."

WHITWORTH MEMORIAL GARDENS AWARDED GREEN FLAG STATUS

Whitworth Town Council are delighted that Whitworth Memorial Gardens have been awarded Green Flag status. The Green Flag Award recognises and rewards well-managed parks and green spaces and sets a benchmark for the standard of outdoor spaces, acknowledging the hard work put in by the local community.



In 2011, refurbishment at the gardens began thanks to the dedication and hard work of Anita Farrow and the Whitworth and Healey Horticultural Society. With lottery grants and funding from Rossendale Borough Council, Lancashire County Council and Whitworth Town Council as well as other organisations, a new stone area was provided for the town's well known brass band. A beautiful rose bed complete with David Austin roses was also planted and new railings were installed.

Today the Gardens are maintained by the Whitworth in Bloom volunteers, Rossendale Borough Council employees, and further enhanced by local community groups for all ages. The latest project taking place here is a collaboration between Whitworth Men in Sheds and 41st Rochdale (Whitworth) Scout group to make and install bird and bat boxes.

WHITWORTH SPORTS FESTIVAL

For a decade before Covid Whitworth had its own Sports Festival. Whitworth Sports Council is aiming to revive it next June – if there is support for it. Not just as in “That’d be a nice idea – wonder what they’ll put on?” but more “What is there that I (or my club) could do to contribute?”



Sports Festival was a collective concern, with those of us passionate about sport coming together for a week to offer events to those who might, unaccountably, never have tried out our amazing pastime! Some groups might do that by putting on a taster event when, ideally for free, people could come along and have a go, at anything from angling or archery to yoga and Zumba. Or we might run a tournament, to encourage a little friendly competition. Sometimes the football club, for instance, would organize a junior tournament and invite other clubs along, and spectators with their children, who might be looking to join and play next season. The valley's primary schools would compete at all sorts – tag rugby, quick cricket, try golf, pop lacrosse. Some crazy cyclists organised a KOM event up Whitworth Rake.

MIKE ROYDS

In May 2025, WTC and Rossendale Borough Council councillor and past Mayor of Whitworth Mike Royds sadly passed away. He joined Whitworth Town Council in 2021 and, in just four years, worked hard to proudly represent the community of Whitworth.

He was elected Mayor of Whitworth in 2023, just days before Rossendale Borough Council (RBC) made the heartbreaking decision to close Whitworth Leisure Centre. He worked tirelessly in those first few mayoral months, meeting with representatives from RBC on numerous occasions and, together with an incredible group of local people who quickly formed Whitworth Leisure Centre CIC, brought the baths back into the ownership of the town in December 2023, culminating with it reopening to the public in February 2024. This wasn't the only issue that Mike had to deal with, but whatever he did turn his attention to received the same amount of professionalism and effort. GOOD GRIEF, NO CROSSWORD!

INTRODUCING WORDFINDER

After all of which, if you've got your pen handy... Starter word this time is **SPHERICAL**

Jot your words on a piece of paper, or on the blank bits of this page. 70 - good. 90 - very good. 100 - wow! 108 - chapeau! (And pat yourself on the back.)

PS Special features to look out for:

- Five homophone twosomes (words that sound the same but are spelled differently) e.g. *gate* and *gait*... and a threesome
- Two 7-letter words

100 words may take you a while, so here's one for your mid-morning coffee break.

You might get to double the other number hiding in your snack.

(You can't have the obvious ex-England football manager, since... third rule. 3 possible answers end in -s, but without breaking first or second rule.)

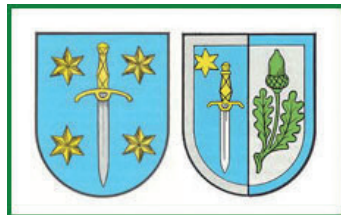
WHITWORTH TOWN TWINNING COMMUNITY GROUP

Keep an eye out for updates - and get ready for a whole new gym experience later this year!

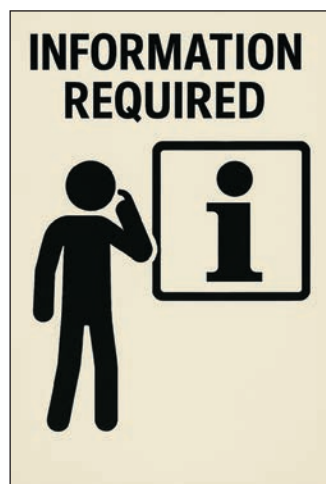

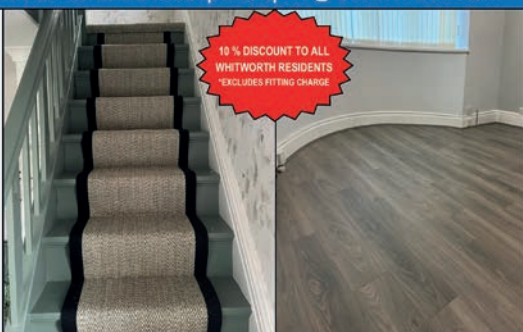

ENVIRONMENT AND WILDLIFE COMMITTEE - SAVE OUR BEES

To help bees, providing bee-friendly flowers for food sources, allowing wild areas to flourish for nesting habitats, and reducing pesticide use are key steps.



Conservation Tips:

- **Plant for Pollinators** - Plant a variety of nectar- and pollen-rich flowers, shrubs, and trees in gardens to provide food sources all-year.
- **Create Wildflower Meadows** - Sow wildflower seeds, mimicking natural wildflower cycles. Include cornflowers, cowslips, and common poppies.
- **Reduce Pesticide Use** - Avoid pesticides; they can harm bees and other beneficial insects.
- **Allow Natural Growth** - Leave patches of garden to grow wild, providing nesting and feeding sites for bees.
- **Build Bee Hotels** - Provide artificial nesting sites by creating or purchasing bee hotels with different sized tubes.
- **Provide Water** - Offer shallow dishes of water with pebbles for bees to land on safely.
- **Minimise Grass Cutting** - Cut your grass less; leave cuttings to allow plants to flower and provide forage.
- **B-Lines** - Support initiatives like B-lines to connect areas of wildflower-rich habitats.
- **Educate** - Learn about bee conservation and share knowledge with others to raise awareness and encourage participation.
- **Consider Bee Health** - If you keep honeybees, avoid spreading diseases, ensuring no competition with wild bees for resources.

WHITWORTH MUSEUM

From the collection - Many will be familiar with a food product that was regularly advertised on television from 1973 through until 1992; Cadbury's Smash. Although the product had been introduced by Cadbury's in the 1960s, it was not until the British advertising agency Boase Massimi Pollitt introduced the Smash Martians in 1973 that the product became incredibly popular. The nature of the advert changed several times over the years but the version probably best remembered is the 1974 "Laughing Martians". In this version the Martians poked fun at human kind for first peeling potatoes with metal knives, boiling them for 25 minutes before "smashing them to bits"; all this instead of using Smash potato granules. The conclusion was that humans were a "most primitive people".

The museum's Smash storage tin exhibit dates from the mid 1980s and is fitted with an electronic laughing device on the underside of the lid. The device was activated each time the tin was opened and the laugh continued for about 30 seconds. Perhaps surprisingly, even after 40 years, the device still works! **"For mash get Smash".**

Whitworth Museum is open each Saturday from 11.00am – 4.00pm.
