WHITWORTH IN BLOOM'S CEMETERY GANG

We are lucky enough to have a dedicated team of volunteers who work in all weathers to enhance the floral aspect of our wonderfully positioned cemetery. They are a knowledgeable lot who employ their gardening skills to think about the long-term sustainability of the green space and have started planting perennials which can be divided to provide year on year colour or sustenance for insect life. They either store or leave bulbs in situ and try, where possible, to re-use annuals in a variety of pots that may be donated or simply rescued!

Because they are prudent gardeners, they manage to find extra plants to decorate plots that have not been tended for years and give these graves some care and attention such as the Stott tomb in front of the chapel which burst into colour last summer.

As if their gardening activities weren't enough, they are also putting together a photo exhibition showcasing the buildings and elements of the fascinating history of the cemetery. This can be viewed at the Leisure Centre from 2nd to 24th April, then at the library from 15th May to 5th June.

COUNCILLOR ALAN NEAL

Councillor Alan Neal has been invited to serve as President of the Lancashire Association of Local Councils (LALC), which represents around two hundred town and parish councils across the county.

Councillor Neal has been a member of the LALC Executive Committee since 1987 and has served in a number of leadership roles during that time, reflecting his long-standing commitment to local government and to the communities it serves.



His appointment as President follows many years of involvement with LALC, including time as both Vice Chair and Chair, two periods as the Lancashire Delegate to the National Association of Local Councils, and a decade as Vice President. Being invited by his peers to take on the presidency marks a significant moment in his long public service career.

Councillor Neal said: "To be invited to serve as President of LALC is both an honour and a privilege. I have worked alongside town and parish councillors from across Lancashire for many years, and to have their confidence and support means a great deal. Local councils play a vital role in representing and strengthening their communities, and I am committed to supporting them in this role."

Councillor Neal has served on Whitworth Town Council since 1987 and on Rossendale Borough Council since 1988. His decades of service demonstrate his consistent dedication to his community and to local democracy across Lancashire.

PROTECT OUR FARMERS, PROTECT OUR LIVESTOCK

As lambing season begins, farmers in Whitworth and the surrounding hills face a serious and upsetting problem: sheep worrying by dogs. Every year, sheep and lambs are chased or attacked, often suffering severe injuries or dying. Even when not physically harmed, stress can cause sheep to miscarry, abandon lambs, or become unwell. These incidents are devastating for farmers – and they are completely preventable.



The law is clear: dogs must be kept on a short lead near livestock at all times. This applies on footpaths, open land and roads, even if your dog is usually well behaved. A dog chasing sheep is an offence, whether injury is caused or not.

Recent updates to the law give police stronger powers, including seizing dogs, taking DNA samples, and issuing tougher penalties. Livestock worrying is now treated very seriously.

Whitworth's hill farmers already work in challenging conditions. One loose dog can undo months of hard work in minutes, affecting livelihoods and wellbeing.

The solution is simple: always keep dogs on leads near livestock. By doing so, you protect animals, support local farmers, and respect our countryside.

Please keep dogs on leads. No exceptions.

VETERANS IN COMMUNITIES COMPLETES A BUSY TWELVE MONTHS

Supporting ex-service personnel, blue light veterans and families through connection, practical guidance, outreach and community activity, VIC based in Haslingden has continued to provide a welcoming centre where members can drop in for a brew, conversation, and access to groups and partner support. Outreach sessions have also remained a key part of delivery, helping veterans and families connect locally across Middleton, Rochdale, Burnley, Accrington, Clitheroe and Preston.

2025 included a strong programme of wellbeing and inclusion activity, from arts and crafts sessions, and themed painting days, to model railway projects, Veterans in Production builds, outdoor experiences and shared trips. Armed Forces Week activity included local flag-raising ceremonies and a family fun day at the VIC Centre. Remembrance remained central through community tributes, the Rossendale Walk of Remembrance and a Battlefields Tour to France and Belgium.

Crucially, VIC isn't only for people in crisis. Many members attend simply to reconnect, build routine, volunteer and enjoy being around fellow veterans, blue light colleagues and families in a safe, respectful environment. Support is there when needed, but belonging is the starting point.

SKYLINE 11

Skyline 11 will take place on Sunday May 24th. The route this year will run clockwise, which means we will be climbing up Rooley Moor Road... but it's a flat finish back to the Golf Club. The full walk is, as ever, 14 miles long (a proper challenge, to be taken seriously), but there will be the usual two shorter options for those for whom that is too much of a challenge: the Western Skyline to Britannia is 9 miles long – still stiff because it too includes the ascent of RMR – while the Skyline Sunday Stroll is a gentler, but varied, 3-miler, concluding at the foot of RMR.



Entry forms will appear in all sorts of locations at the start of April. Instructions for where to return them will be on the form – available from Seasons, the Council Office and Whitworth Leisure Centre. Online entries available too. Please see the Whitworth Skyline Facebook page or the Town Council's events page for more details.

You'll need to register at the Golf Club between 7.45am and 9am (no later please), then off you go, at your own pace, on your chosen challenge. Every walker gets a (small) meal at the end, though if your chosen walk doesn't finish at the Golf Club, you'll need to organise yourself a lift to get back up there. Please note that, as in previous years, no dogs are to take part in the Skyline walk. And fingers crossed, please, for trek-friendly weather.

If anyone would like to be part of the event, but doesn't want to walk, Skyline needs marshals, and backmarkers (but that does involve a bit of slow walking), and maybe one or two people to help out in the kitchen at the Golf Club. WHITWORTH MUSEUM – FROM THE COLLECTION

We tend to think that personalised items, whether bought as mementoes or given as gifts, are a relatively new phenomenon; this is not so. From about 1875, Measham Ware, a type of ceramic barge ware, was produced in Church Gresley, Derbyshire. The purchaser could request that the item be personalised with a name or inscription before firing. In 1878 one such item, a teapot complete with lid, was purchased by, or given as a gift to, Mary Dearden of Millgate, Whitworth. Unfortunately, we do not know if the date 1878 had any significance for Mary but we do know that she was the wife of Daniel Dearden and she sadly died just three years later in 1881 aged just 59. She was interred at Facit Cemetery.

This highly decorated item is one of the earliest known examples of Measham Ware still in existence.

Whitworth Museum, located in North Street, is open to the public each Saturday between 11.00am – 4.00pm throughout the year and at other times by appointment. Please email secretary@whitworthhistoricalsociety.org.uk for more information.

There are loads. 73 gets you a rating of GOOD, 87 VERY GOOD, 99 BRILLIANT. If you can squeeze over 100, hats off to you.



Rossendale Community First Responders (RCFR) are dedicated local volunteers, trained by the North West Ambulance Service, who give their time to support the community when it matters most. Responding to 999 medical emergencies across the Rossendale Valley, RCFR work closely alongside ambulance crews to provide vital early care in those crucial first minutes before an ambulance arrives.

Beyond emergency response, the team is actively involved in community training sessions and public engagement events, helping residents gain essential life-saving skills. RCFR regularly delivers CPR and defibrillator awareness training, empowering members of the public to act confidently and effectively in emergencies.

RCFR is currently keen to hear from people in the Whitworth area who may be interested in becoming "the lifesaver next door". If you live or work locally, are aged 18 or over, have access to your own vehicle and want to make a difference, volunteering could be right for you.

The group also works closely with its sister organisation, Community Defibrillators for Rossendale, raising funds and maintaining Community Public Access Defibrillators throughout the valley. These lifesaving devices are vital in cases of sudden cardiac arrest, giving communities the best possible chance to save a life.

DAWN TAYLOR

In the New Year Honours List, Dawn Taylor was awarded the British Empire Medal for her work with Rossendale's First Responders. She is also the force behind Community Defibs for Rossendale and has helped to install the defibrillators across Whitworth and the rest of Rossendale. Everyone here at Whitworth Town Council would like to congratulate Dawn on her well-deserved award and we know that she would like to use this as an opportunity for more locations for local defibrillators to be installed.

In Dawn's own words "In December 2009, I received the Rossendale Woman of the Year Award from Rossendale Hospice, having been nominated by members of Team Rossendale CFRs. I began to consider how I could use the Award to raise the profile of community care. Knowing how important Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) are in the care of Sudden Cardiac Arrest patients and having seen items on the internet about public access AEDs elsewhere in the world, I approached two of my CFR colleagues – Brian Pickup and Andrew Walmsley – to see if they would support the idea of installing the devices in Rossendale.

"Together we formed Community Defibs for Rossendale. In February 2011, we installed what we believe was the first Community Public Access Defibrillator (CPAD) in the North West Ambulance Service (NWAS) area on Bank Street, Rawtenstall. Funds for this, and subsequent units, were raised by members of the community. In 2025, there are currently over 90 units in the Valley. My sincere thanks to all those who have supported me throughout my journey. I am very grateful for the support and encouragement I have received over the past 21 years during my time with the Rossendale CFR Team, in particular my mentors Brian Pickup, Richard Peters, Andrew Walmsley and Dean Hebden."

HALLFOLD UNITED REFORMED CHURCH

Hallfold United Reformed Church is a building known to many in the valley. The origins of the church date back to 1698 when the first congregation met in a farmhouse at the top of Hallfold. In the 1700s, the first Hallfold Chapel was built on a site near the graveyard and lodge, at the Hall Street/Wallbank Drive junction. By the mid 1800s, the original church was deemed too small for the growing band of worshippers and a new church was built on Hall Street, adjacent to the Whitworth High School/Hall Street junction. Eventually, this building was also demolished and a new sanctuary, formerly the Sunday School, was dedicated in the 1970s.

The church is looking forward to its Easter services and extends a warm invitation to anyone who would like to attend. WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL PRECEPT 2026/2027

Whitworth Town Council has this year set a net budget of £83,914. The Council has worked hard to keep the increase in the precept to a minimum, which has been difficult in the current financial climate. Statutory wage increases and inflationary increases in office rent has meant that Council has had to take the difficult decision to increase the Precept this year but has managed to offset some of the increases by making savings in other areas.

This past year has seen some pressures on finances and significant increases in costs, but the Town Council's wise investments are still providing a healthy dividend, thanks to favourable interest rates.

Employee costs include salaries for the Town Clerk (30 hours), Business Administration Apprentice (30 hours), our full-time Whitworth Town Caretaker, who makes a significant impact on the town's cleanliness, and our Parish Lengthsman, who tackles repairs and general maintenance around the town.

The Valley News magazine, produced quarterly, continues to be hugely popular, and the Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee has a variety of leisure and cultural events planned for the year ahead, information about which is included on the Town Council website. The Town Council continues to promote Whitworth as a great place to live, and lobbies hard for the best possible services for the town. It is at the forefront of tackling crime through the sponsorship of the Police Community Support Vehicle and facilitates monthly multi-agency meetings attended by all the local agencies.

To conclude, the Town Council continues to be proud of its achievements and looks forward to working with and for the people of Whitworth during the forthcoming financial year.


