

LANCASHIRE LOST WAYS PROJECT

Do you enjoy researching old maps? Lancashire Local Access Forum is looking for volunteers to research and identify lost public rights of way. The Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 (CROW) proposes that all unrecorded footpaths and bridleways cannot be recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement after 1 January 2026 and the rights over them will be lost. Lancashire Local Access Forum wants to ensure worthwhile public rights of way currently unrecorded will not be lost at the 2026 cut-off, and your help is needed to identify them.

The Lancashire Lost Ways project aims to harness the enthusiasm and local knowledge of communities to identify previously unrecorded public rights of way. Whitworth volunteers will search records for good evidence of public rights of way in the town which are not currently recorded. Those routes will then be considered for inclusion on the Definitive Map and Statement; of particular interest are those which provide missing links in the network, lead into the countryside from residential areas or bypass busy roads.

The County Council hopes that by working in partnership with the community the process to have these rights of way legally recognised and safeguarded for future generations can begin. TACKLING LAZY DOG OWNERS

Uncollected dog mess is a problem in Whitworth and across the UK – it clogs up shoes, prams and wheelchairs, smells, and is a danger to our children's health, as they're more likely to fall or slip in it. Our Town Clerk takes more phonecalls and emails on this issue than pretty much any other. While the Town Council isn't the authority with the powers to legislate against the problem, it is nonetheless trying to tackle the problem as best it can through a number of ideas and initiatives. In addition to the spray painting of 'clear it up' signage on pavements in hot-spot areas, as detailed in the last edition of this magazine, the Town Council has produced window clings – like stickers but without the stickiness. They are being delivered to homes and businesses on the main road and in areas with problems around uncollected mess, and it is hoped that by displaying these in front windows they will act as a deterrent and embarrass the perpetrators into changing their ways. This problem is down to a relatively small number of irresponsible owners – realistically we will never eradicate the problem



entirely, but with your help, the Town Council can try and make Whitworth and cleaner and better place to live.

LANCASHIRE TEENAGERS CREATE NEW RELATIONSHIP APP

Here's one that may be of interest to Whitworth teenagers. Lancashire Youth Council's Sex and Relationships campaign group has been involved in developing a new smartphone app to help young people take control of their relationships, working with young people from across the world. Young people who feel they are being manipulated by their partner can get advice and

support from 'stiritapp', which can be accessed via http://stiritup.eu/. Stiritapp uses stories and quizzes to encourage young people to think about positive ways to work their way through difficult relationships, as well as offering support and advice. It comes after studies showed that more than 4 in 10 English teenage schoolgirls reported experiencing sexual coercion, and many 13-17 year olds had also suffered physical attacks, intimidation or emotional coercion. Young people from Lancashire helped design questionnaires that were completed by 4,500 teenagers in England, Norway, Italy, Bulgaria and Cyprus. Their work was recently showcased at a Safeguarding Teenage Intimate Relationships (STIR) convention in London. The group is planning to go into schools to promote the app and is designing posters for schools, youth clubs and other places where young people can see the information.



WALKING FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT TO RAISE FUNDS FOR THE RAFT FOUNDATION

The Raft Foundation is a community group formed in 2012 to serve and support the Rossendale community. Projects to date include the provision of the largest food bank in the Valley – in 2014, the organisation delivered over 44,000 meals. To raise funds, the Raft Foundation is holding its second Walking Football tournament on Saturday 13 June at Marl Pits in Rawtenstall. Whitworth Photographic Society will be acting as the tournament's official photographers. INSPECTOR PAUL LEIGH, LANCASHIRE CONSTABULARY

"Greetings to you all; I hope the worst of the cold weather is now over and we can look forward to a beautiful Whitworth summer. With the improvement in the weather and the longer evenings this is a great time to be out in our gardens or to open the windows in our homes to let the fresh air in. However there's always the risk of someone seeing this as a potential opportunity to sneak into properties. These offences are rare and I wouldn't want to discourage people from making the most of the summer (it may not be that long!) however by taking simple precautions and remaining vigilant you can deter potential offenders and prevent the likelihood of becoming a victim of crime.

Another benefit of the sunny evening is that Whitworth's young people can play out and enjoy some physical activity away from their televisions and

games consoles. I would ask that parents are proactive in knowing where and what their children are doing. We've recently successfully bid for £700 to repair damage at the bowling green and replace plants. Hopefully there are young people willing to get involved in the planting over the next few months and maybe try a game of bowls. We work and live in a beautiful, safe and peaceful part of Lancashire and by pulling together as a community we can keep it that way." For contact details for the Police, see the outer back page.

WHITWORTH CARE TRUST SERVICES SECURED FOR FUTURE WITH PLANS FOR NEW 28 BED FACILITY

ST JOHN'S CLOCK

Tick tock, tick tock, can you hear St John's clock...? No, has been the answer for the past few months. However, after much discussion in the PCC it was decided that something should be done about it. The clock was installed in 1969 as a gift to St John's Church by the Train family. They decided that the clock should be dedicated to Mrs Ada Train, but that this should happen whilst she was alive, not afterwards, as is normally the case. Being 45 years old, the clock mechanism couldn't be repaired, as the parts were no longer in production, so a brand new system had to be installed together with two new face centres, as the old ones were cracked and dull.

However, nothing of this nature is straightforward. Upon stripping out the old mechanism, it was found that the metal straps fastened to the church tower walls to support the clock drive shafts were completely corroded and couldn't be adjusted. New ones were required considerable extra cost. Thankfully, the work is now complete and the trusted timepiece began turning again on 19 March. Let's hope for 45 years more timekeeping from the clock on top of the hill for the people of Whitworth. Tick tock, tick tock, tick tock!



WHITWORTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY - THE HIDDEN SHOE

The term 'Deliberately Concealed Garments' describes items of clothing, often belonging to children, that have been deliberately hidden within the structure or fabric of a building. Evidence suggests this practice dates back to the Middle Ages but the reason for doing so is unknown. Whitworth Museum has such an object in the form of a child's shoe which is believed to date from the late 18th Century. The shoe was uncovered by local builders during a restoration project on a house in Taylor Street, Whitworth. Discovery of these objects, although not uncommon, is nevertheless historically significant. The condition of the article at time of concealment is thought to have some relevance but the reasoning behind this is not known.

The museum's exhibit is clearly well-worn and the inner sole, whether by accident or design, has been fractured. The hand welted construction, used from c.1500 onwards, helps in dating the item although without the use of advanced techniques complete accuracy is not possible. This item and many others can be seen at Whitworth Museum in North Street; admission is free and the museum is open throughout the year on Tuesdays 7.30pm - 9.30pm and on Saturdays 2.00pm - 4.00pm.





ANNUAL REPORT, WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL

MAYOR'S OVERVIEW

Time certainly files when you're having fun — I can scarcely believe that it's twelve months since the last Annual Parish meeting. As Mayor and Mayoress, Susan and I have had a wonderful, fulfilling, privileged time — we've been invited to well over 100 events in Whitworth and further afield and have managed to get to all but a handful of them. Personal highlights include the Sports Festival last June and November's Remembrance commemorations — our Festival of Remembrance concert sold out and I was astonished and humbled by the numbers who paid their respects on Remembrance Sunday. I've also hugely enjoyed chairing meetings of the town council, and I thank the members of the public who have attended our meetings to raise issues or concerns.

The Town Council continues to be at the fore of a variety of initiatives, and many are detailed here; it provides a dedicated service to the town whilst staying within its limited budget. It is through prudent financial management and much discussion and research that the Council has again managed to keep its precept at the same level, with a 0% increase for the fifth year running. Over and above core duties, the Town Council works alongside other councils and agency organisations, and with residents and businesses, to get the best for Whitworth and its residents. The Town Council often leads on these discussions and our Clerk facilitates numerous meetings throughout the year. The Town Council also upholds the rights and values of the town in its role as a pressure group and a sounding board for local opinion.

2015 has been an election year for the Town Council, with all 12 seats available. As it turned out, 12 candidates were nominated and so the election was uncontested. We say a fond farewell and offer grateful thanks to David Barnes and Marie Gibbons, who decided not to stand again this time. We also extend a warm welcome to new councillors Cheryl Brine and Donna Nutt and look forward to working with them.

Over and above the Town Council, our wonderful community rallies around to make sure that there are events and initiatives taking place throughout the year. There are many organisations and charities that work tirelessly, many on a voluntary basis, to improve Whitworth and make it a great place to live. It never ceases to amaze me how a relatively small town can have so much taking place within it, and so many devoted, hard working members of the community. We have an enviable amount and variety of sporting and leisure activities available all year round; the Tourism and Leisure Committee and Sports Council both produce events and festivals, working with other local organisations, often on a voluntary basis. We're also very fortunate to have such an active voluntary sector in our town, and the Town Council sends sincere thanks to everyone who strives to make Whitworth a better place to live.

Because of the elections we are, as I write, unsure of who will become Mayor from May 2015, however I am sure that whichever councillor takes on the role will do a thorough and professional job. In the months ahead, the Town Council will make the best of its opportunities and strengths and work its way through any challenges. The Town Council's staff and councillors, as always, remain fully committed and look forward to the year to come.

INITIATIVES

The Council is supported by Town Clerk Karen Douglas, who works 30 hours a week. The Council also contracts Parish Lengthsman, John Leyland, for general repairs and maintenance, including attending to Public Rights of Way, mending foothpaths and undertaking a multitude of jobs in and around the town. The Council employs a full-time Town Caretaker, Glen Iliff, a position funded in part by Rossendale Borough Council. Glen litter-picks targeted sites the length and breadth of the town, and reports issues to the Clerk. All three maintain healthy attendance sheets and have been employed by the council for between 8 and 12 years – a testament to their professionalism and commitment.

The Town Council's website, www.whitworth.gov.uk, aims to be a one-stop-shop for Whitworth information for residents and visitors, and is updated by the Town Clerk. The Town Council also makes use of social media; its Facebook page is regularly contributed to.

The Horticultural Society continues to do a wonderful job ensuring the town looks its blooming best, tending to flowerbeds and the planter boxes provided by Northern Joinery Ltd. The Society works proactively with all the councils, and is financially supported in part by the Town Council.

The Town Council-produced quarterly Whitworth Valley News magazine continues to be a popular read, featuring editorial contributions and 62 paying advertisers. It involves a significant amount of work for the Clerk but is very well received and ensures all in Whitworth are upto-date with town news and developments. A change in printing contract has seen the costs of producing the magazine drop significantly, and it is delivered to all homes by Sports Council volunteers.

The Town Council contributes towards the fight against crime with the continued sponsorship of the Whitworth community police car, which has proved invaluable to the local constabulary, and which the Town Council recently resolved to support for a further three-year period.

The Town Council works in partnership with Rossendale and Lancashire Councils and other local organisations including Lancashire Police and Green Vale Homes to get the best possible services for Whitworth. For example, the Town Council facilitates monthly multi-agency meetings, when

representatives of all the main agencies come together to tackle town issues. The Town Council takes a proactive approach to tackling litter and uncollected dog-mess issues, supporting legislative work undertaken by the Borough Council, issuing letters to residents around particular 'grotspot' areas, and launching two new initiatives this year — a pavement stencil in hot spot areas (in partnership with the Borough Council) and window stickers issued to homes and businesses requesting people pick up their dog mess.

The Tourism and Leisure Committee, featuring councillor and non-councillor members, organises or part-organises a large number of events - this past year's offer has included the Rushcart, Christmas Lights Switch On, New Year's Duck Race, St George Celebrations, Family Fun Day and the Whitworth Calendar. The Committee is working on all these projects again, plus the fifth Whitworth Scarecrow Festival which takes place in June. The Town Council itself organises Whitworth's Remembrance Sunday commemorations and the Community Carol Service. All these events serve to preserve and strengthen the town's identity and support a sense of community and civic pride. Comprising town councillors and representatives of local sporting organisations, the Whitworth Sports Council continues to flourish, with plans for the 2015 Sports Festival well underway.

Since 2007, Whitworth Town Council has held Quality Status, a nationally recognised quality benchmark. This has been replaced by the Local Council Award Scheme. It encourages progression by including three award levels: Foundation, Quality and Quality Gold — Whitworth Town Council has successfully achieved the Foundation level and is now working towards its Quality level.

TOWN TWINNING

Whitworth has been twinned with Kandel for almost 49 years now - in July 2014 a Whitworth delegation visited Germany for seven days, staying with Kandel families and enjoying a programme of activities. A Kandel delegation will visit Whitworth later this year. Cllrs Aldred and Mellor are instrumental in keeping the twinning alive, and thanks are due to them; if you wish to get involved with Town Twinning please contact them.

CIVIC EVENTS

2014's municipal year began with Mayor-Making at the Riverside, followed by Civic Sunday at St Anselm's Church. Rev Father Frank Thorpe has acted as Mayoral Chaplain this year and many thanks are offered to him. As always, the Remembrance Sunday commemorations were extremely well attended, as was the schools Armistice day event in November and the Festival of Remembrance organised by the Town Council, the Riverside and the Mayors of Rossendale and Whitworth. The Community Carol Service at the Riverside was led by Hallfold UR Church and was very

popular; the junior band did a great job accompanying the carols and a joyful time was had by all. The Civic Dinner and Dance last month was a successful evening; over £500 was raised for the Mayor's Charity Fund, food provided by Lords the Caterers and entertainment was from the Whitworth Vale & Healey Band.

PLANNING

As a statutory planning consultee, the Town Council passes comment on all Whitworth applications; Rossendale Borough Council takes these observations into account when reaching planning decisions. Since April 2014, 26 applications have been considered by the Town Council. The Town Council is also consulted on Highways proposals and other consultations which relate to or affect the Whitworth area.

CONCLUSION

Whitworth Town Council continues to work to the best of its ability to serve its community. The quality of the council is monitored and ratified through the benchmark council awards scheme, and the feedback from the community is overwhelmingly positive. The Town Council strives to be accessible; the magazine, website and social media use facilitate communications with the community, and the town clerk and councillors' availability, alongside publicly attended council meetings, enable communication in person. The Town Council works with local organisations and authorities to improve its offer and to enhance the lives of everyone in Whitworth, striving to monitor and deal with issues or problems swiftly. It is always looking for innovative ideas to tackle problems, and initiatives such as the support of the Whitworth police car and the partnership working with Rossendale Council on controlling dog mess and making a real and positive difference to daily lives. The Town Council also continues to provide and support a range of fun, family events throughout the year, encouraging community spirit and togetherness. There will be challenges and opportunities presented over the year ahead, but the Town Council is well equipped to deal with both.

WHITWORTH COMMUNITY HIGH OPEN FOR STUDY DURING HOLIDAYS
