PITCHES UPDATE - WHITWORTH VALLEY FOOTBALL CLUB AND WHITWORTH SPORTS COUNCIL

As WVN goes to press we are uncertain of the future of pitches in the Valley.

The consultation on pitches ended in September and there was a massive amount of support opposing the proposed house build on the pitches at John Street and Rawstron Street.

Rossendale Council are awaiting the recommendations of a Pitch Strategy report that is expected to completed at the end of October, so we will know more then.

The 'Keep Our Pitches' demonstration at John Street captured the strength of feeling in the Valley. Many thanks to all of you for all of your support writing letters, completing consultation forms and signing petitions.

Although there is uncertainty we are looking forward and planning for the future. There are several developments that we want to keep you updated on;

The pitch at Leavengreave is in the process of transferring to Whitworth Sports Council under a fifty year lease arrangement. One of the conditions of the lease is that we need to have brought the area back into use within five years. When the lease is signed we will be in a position to look at funding opportunities to improve and develop the site. Initially we will need to secure the area, then we can look at options for drainage and developing facilities.

There is a twenty five year lease for the pitch at Rawstron Street that Whitworth Valley Football Club have signed over the last two weeks. This will ensure that we can apply for funding to make improvements to the ground. We have had financial support from the Co-Operative group and Tesco over the last eighteen months to help develop and improve the changing rooms and also lot of work done by trade professionals giving their time to help upgrade the site. A new kitchen has been added, new toilets and showers have been installed and the changing rooms have been redecorated and revamped. We are currently looking at funding opportunities for replacement of the metal railings surrounding the pitch and installation of some windows and doors in the changing rooms.

Whitworth Swimming Club has enjoyed a productive few months with an even busier period planned up to the Christmas break.

Neighbourhood Forums can give grants of up to £500 to local community groups that can provide added value to the residents of the Borough. The work that the grants will fund must fit in with or complement the priorities identified by the Neighbourhood Forums.


WHITWORTH YOUNG PEOPLE'S CENTRE

CROOK HILL COMMUNITY FUND NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS!

PARTNERSHIPS FOR RENEWABLES

In October 2015, Partnerships for Renewables completed the construction of eleven wind turbines at Crook Hill. The owners of the site, Crook Hill Properties Ltd will donate £35,000 each year to the Fund for the operational life of the project which is expected to be 20 - 25 years. Groups with worthwhile local projects can now apply for amounts between £250 and £10,000.

Community projects located within a 5km radius of the wind farm will be eligible for funding, and a panel of local people will decide which applications the Fund should support. There will be a single application round each year.

The Fund is being administered by national grant-making charity GrantScape. Local groups are encouraged to apply through the GrantScape website www.grantscape.org.uk . If your project needs funding, the first application deadline is Wednesday, 24th February 2016. The first round of decisions will be made by the end of April 2016.



WHITWORTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

As the last Vulcan took to the skies for the final time this year we remember a Whitworth man's contribution to its development. John Keiley grew up at Fold Head Farm and brought his own family up on Fairway. His aptitude for electrical engineering led him to a career in aviation. He worked for Avro on aircraft at the leading edge of

technology and was most proud of his work on the Vulcan Bomber.

When the first Vulcan was delivered to the Royal Air Force it was taken for a round the world trip to showcase its advanced design. Between 9 September and 1 October 1956, XA897 flew to Australia and New Zealand accompanied by three Avro Shackletons containing ground-crew and parts to service the Vulcan. As a member of the technical team John was co-opted into the RAF as Flight Lieutenant.

Controversially as the Vulcan flew back into Heathrow in poor weather it crashed killing four crew. It was a tense time for the family until they learned John was safe on a following aircraft.

John's retirement presentation in 1978 was made by the former Air Chief Marshal, Sir Harry Broadhurst who had led the Vulcan's circumnavigation.

A MESSAGE FROM THE MP

2015 has been an incredibly busy year. This includes people most 'at risk' from serious complications of flu such as Bronchitis and Pneumonia. You are eligible to receive a free flu jab if you:

• are 65 years of age or over

• are pregnant

- Children and Adults with an underlying health condition (particularly long-term heart or respiratory disease)
- are living in a long-stay residential care home or other long-stay care facility
- receive a carer's allowance, or you are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person whose welfare may be at risk if you fall ill
- are a healthcare worker with direct patient contact or a social care worker.

An annual flu vaccine nasal spray is also offered to healthy children aged 2, 3 and 4 years old (on 31 August 2015).
