








ALPINE FLOWERS WILL FESTOON THE RIVERSIDE

After the tremendous success of recent events, Whitworth will again play host to a national horticultural event when the Alpine Garden Society stage another huge Spring Flower Show at the Civic Hall (Riverside) on Saturday 21 March. The event attracts exhibitors, judges, nurserymen and enthusiasts from across the country, and features over 140 individual classes ranging from rare alpine gems to bulbs, conifers, ferns and mini-gardens. Unusual plants from around the globe will vie for your attention with nurserymen selling the cream of alpine plants, while many of the nation's leading exhibitors will be competing for a number of highly prestigious medals and trophies. Shows held in the hall in the 1990s and more recently attracted marvellous attendances and the

TOWN AND BOROUGH COUNCIL JOIN FORCES TO TACKLE DOG FOULING

Dog fouling is an important and much complained about issue. At a recent Whitworth Town Council meeting, a proposal was put forward to deliver a pilot project in Whitworth aimed at encouraging dog owners to clean up after their dogs, based on schemes operated successfully in other areas of the country such as Liverpool. The scheme includes marking out a 'clean it up' symbol on pavements in temporary paint and displaying highly visible glow in the dark signage in hot spot areas. Lancashire County Council and Rossendale Council are supportive of the project, and the town and

borough councils are working on developing the project for implementation in spring 2015. Rossendale Council has also recently entered into a partnership with Burnley Council to deliver proactive dog enforcement patrols throughout the borough, including Whitworth; since the arrangement started in mid-October over 100 patrols have been carried out across the borough and a fixed penalty notice has been issued to someone exercising 3 dogs on a sports pitch, which is a dog exclusion area.

SCHOOL REPORT

IT'S GREAT TO BE GOOD

Whitworth Community High School was delighted to achieve an overall Good rating by Ofsted in its latest inspection in December. Inspectors acknowledged the significant improvements in leadership and management, teaching, achievement, behaviour and safety since the school was last inspected in 2013, when it was deemed to 'require improvement.'

Headteacher Gillian Middlemas is commended in the report for her 'steely determination' which has secured rapid improvements in all areas, especially teaching and achievement,



with the strong support of governors and the shared vision of all leaders. Ofsted reported that standards are improving at a faster rate than nationally, and in 2014 students attained significantly better results in many subjects than in previous years. Students are 'immensely proud of their school. They talk excitedly about the improvements seen in the school' and about being listened to, cared for and respected by their teachers. They consider it to be like a family and wear their uniform with pride - with one student commenting: 'the pride I have in my school and the uniform that I wear makes me walk taller.' Mrs Middlemas says 'This is an excellent report, which recognises and celebrates the fantastic progress, shared vision and hard work of everyone in school.'

Postal voting forms must be returned to the elections office by 5pm on 21 April and proxy voting forms by 5pm on 28 April.

Why not consider becoming a Councillor: The Town and Borough Councils rely on local people taking an interest in what happens in their community, and local councillors bring a wealth of knowledge and community understanding to a council.

If you're interested, now is the time to act. You don't need to be a member of a political party; perhaps you're just interested in helping your community and could stand as an Independent. Being a councillor can be an extremely rewarding experience for as little as a couple of hours a week. 




GIRLS UNITED

COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

Rossendale's team of Community First Responders save lives and care for people across the Valley by supporting the ambulance service. Whitworth retired nurse Ken Sutcliffe enjoys making a difference and being a Community First Responder gives him that chance. "After I retired I found there was a vacuum. Then I was in the Red Lion and the landlord Steve Butterworth, who is a First Responder, said why don't I join – so I did." Even though Ken qualified as a nurse in 1968, he still had to undergo the training to become a Responder. He said: "In Whitworth the Responders



are a stock controller, a publican and me. We don't have blue lights and have to stick to the speed limits. We had a call to a cardiac arrest in Whitworth when the Responder saved the person's life, which is rewarding." Responders are needed to provide cover during the day, in the evening and at weekends, with each volunteer working to their availability. All Responders commit to full training organised by the North West Ambulance Service, including an assessment at the end. No previous first aid knowledge is necessary. If you're interested, the team has an awareness session on Wednesday 25 February, 4pm – 8pm at Sunnybank Day Centre, Market Street, Whitworth. GROUP MEETS TO REDUCE FLOODING IN WHITWORTH

Following flooding in recent years a charity called the National Flood Forum is working with local people to set up a group to tackle issues and reduce flooding in Whitworth. Even if your home has not been flooded this can directly benefit you as it will make insurance easier and cheaper if Whitworth becomes less of a flood risk area. One of the biggest challenges in managing flood risk for communities on the River Spodden is that changing weather patterns mean there is more heavy rainfall in summer months, leading to flash flooding.

The Whitworth Flood Forum has succeeded in getting the groups that have responsibility for helping water flow together – the Environment Agency, Rossendale Borough Council and Lancashire County Council all attend the meetings held at Anglo Recycling on Tong Lane. The group is also being supported by Whitworth Town Council; Councillor Karen Ruane attends meetings and her local knowledge, as well as her understanding of the different organisations, is helping the group. Group Chairman, Simon Macaulay, says: "Flooding is a long term issue for Whitworth, and I've been very impressed with the knowledge and enthusiasm of the various bodies that can help us. By working with them, we can greatly reduce the flood

risk in Whitworth in the long term. If you'd like to get involved, please call me on 01706 853513."

WHITWORTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

A Whitworth attraction for locals and visitors alike is a walk around Cowm Reservoir. Today it is a peaceful place with grazing animals and surrounding trees and green fields contributing to the tranquil scene, but in the 1860s the picture was very different. A few years earlier, Rochdale Corporation had decided to build a number of reservoirs at various locations in the surrounding districts, Cowm Valley being the location of the first. Rochdale had

secured the services of Thomas Hawksley, a far-sighted civil engineer who had made the link between good public health and round-the-clock availability of a pressurised clean water supply. Work at Cowm was eventually completed around 1870 and the reservoir began to provide, mainly by gravitational means, a supply of clean water to Whitworth and parts of Rochdale. Construction had not been without problems and Hawksley employed the use of liquid cement grout, at that time a revolutionary new technique, to seal a number of very large fractures in the underlying strata. Whitworth Historical Society membership is open to all and holds regular monthly talks at its North Street museum premises between October and June. The museum is open throughout the year on Tuesdays 7.30pm-9.30pm and on Saturdays 2pm-4pm. Admission is free.
