MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Whitworth Residents and Friends,

I am six months into my term as Mayor of Whitworth, since taking over in May 2024, and have loved every minute of it. The Rushcart Procession, the Dog Show, celebrating our local talent and seeing our achievements on a global, local and national level have been amazing recent events to witness and support.

A recent highlight has been the Mayoral Charity Ball and Awards Evening, where I proudly presented awards to: Eric Halliwell, Andrew Thorpe, Steve Butterworth, Lillie-Mai Davies and the staff of the Co-Op Whitworth branch. All of the award winners won awards for going above and beyond in terms of serving their community.

The evening saw nearly a thousand pounds raised for the charities and groups that I'm supporting this year. Special mentions go to those who attended, our Town Clerk Rachel Hodson, DJ Jules Ullah for the music, The Ashcroft, Lords the Caterers, Karis Serena (female vocalist) and local (Rochdale) band Emma and The Echoes, as well as the volunteers who helped our Mayoress Neressa Baron organise and prepare everything.

The amount of road traffic collisions and traffic offences locally have seemed to increase significantly recently (3 in a week at its height) – but we know we've had this issue for a long time. That's why I authored a 12-page Crime Intelligence Report and called a special meeting about it. I presented the report to our local MP Andy MacNae in person along with other members of Whitworth Town Council. The Police and Crime Commissioner was invited and confirmed to attend but the day before had to send his apologies. His office received a copy of the report later that day. 80% of the content of the report came from Whitworth residents who took the time to contact me personally with reports, ideas and concerns (thank you). I'll be hosting a follow up meeting in the town council chamber early in 2025 to hold those concerned to account on progress and action that needs to be taken on behalf of Whitworth's residents.

As we move into winter, we look forward to several public events. These include the recent Remembrance Sunday commemoration to remember our fallen and to honour residents who have served and those who continue to protect us in the Armed Forces far and wide.

The people of Whitworth are special. We all need to continue to look out for each other, get involved and keep our unique community spirit alive.

WHITWORTH VOLUNTEERS HOST CHRISTMAS CRAFT EXTRAVAGANZA

Whitworth Town Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee have been getting in the Christmas spirit planning the Christmas Celebrations. Following the success of previous year's workshops, the volunteers have decided to do it all again this year with a few added extras! The original wreath-making idea was the brainchild of volunteer member, Linda Parker, to recycle the Christmas tree offcuts the group produce.

The event takes place on Saturday 7th December at The Ashcroft from 10am until 4pm. Crafters can choose between learning the art of Ukrainian egg decorating or making their own Christmas crackers from 10am until 12pm and also there will be a traditional wreath making workshop from 1pm until 4pm. Everything will be provided to make a Ukrainian decorated egg, and attendees can personalise their Christmas crackers by bringing their own gifts for inside the crackers. Traditional, natural materials will be provided for the wreaths, although attendees are welcome to bring

along decorations to customise their wreaths to their own colour scheme. Guests will receive tea, coffee, juice and a mince pie and be entertained by Christmas tunes while they craft. The bar will also be open for those wanting to enjoy some traditional mulled wine or speciality coffee.

Bookings close on Sunday 1st December and places are limited so book now to avoid disappointment! The crafts are priced at £5 per person for Christmas crackers, £10 per person for Ukrainian egg decoration and £20 per person for wreath making. Bookings can be made in person at the Town Council office or via the Town Council website at https://www.whitworth.gov. uk/events/Christmas_Craft_Extravanganza. Christmas cracker making is suitable from those aged 5 and above and Ukrainian egg decorating for those aged 12 and above. All under 16s will need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.



DUCK RACE

Whitworth's Annual New Year's Day Duck Race has become an eggciting success and a popular event in the Whitworth calendar. The ducks take to the water at Cowm Reservoir, Tong Lane on New Year's Day at 1pm.

For those unfamiliar with the concept, numbered ducks sponsored for a pound are entered into the Duck Race. The prize money this year is £150, £125 and £100 for first, second and third place ducks (respectively). Even the last duck wins £25!! Results will be announced at the end of the race and the winners will be contacted to arrange distribution of prizes. All proceeds from the duck race are ploughed back into the tourism and leisure events for Whitworth. Refreshments will be available on the day from the Waterski Centre so come along and enjoy the New Year by supporting this incredibly popular event.



THE REFURBISHMENT OF WHITWORTH MEMORIAL GARDENS

In 2010, Anita Farrow, in her capacity as Treasurer of the Whitworth and Healey Horticultural Society, saw the need to rescue the gardens which had fallen into a sorry state. The priorities were: to use local stone, as befits Whitworth heritage, to construct a hard standing area for the band on Remembrance Sunday; repair paths; replace the metal railings which had been requisitioned in WW2 and never restored; renew trees and plants and add new benches.

Inspired by rose beds Anita had seen on her travels abroad; she had the idea to have a box hedge and 50 roses planted. She approached David Austin Roses and, unbeknown to Anita, the owner himself advised on the type of roses suitable for Pennine gardens, selling them to her for under £5 each. (Current RRP is £30!)



After numerous meetings, emails, letters and phone calls, as well as endless forms to fill in, Anita was offered a grant from Community Spaces. With donations from other sources, the amount raised was £58,000.

Trees have since been planted to commemorate the loved ones of local residents and plaques have been placed on benches. Two acer trees were added in 2018 as special tributes to all those killed or injured in the two world wars.

Work carried out by council gardeners and volunteers resulted in the gardens being ready for an official opening in May 2012. More than 200 people attended and were regaled by the band who finally got to play in their new space.

WHITWORTH MUSEUM - FROM THE COLLECTION



Drainpipe finial handmade from lead

Most of us take the plumbing in our homes for granted and expect the mass of interconnecting pipework to stay out of sight. As recently as the 1950's however, things were very different for plumbing companies. Many of the fittings had to be made by hand from flat lead sheet and formed into the various traps, connections and finials. This could involve a degree of artistry on the part of the leadsmith.

In Whitworth, Varley Brothers ran a very successful business with a well equipped workshop on Market Street. As materials changed from lead to copper, PVC and plastic, so too did the working techniques involved. Inevitably, this change saw the decline of workshop based leadcraft and by the end of the 1960's crafting with lead had all but died out. When in the early 1970's Varley Brothers finally closed down, a number of their specialist plumbing tools, many fashioned locally from wood, were accepted into Whitworth Museum.

SUSTAINABLE CHRISTMAS TIPS TO PROTECT OUR ENVIRONMENT AND WILDLIFE

Whitworth Town Council's Environment and Wildlife Committee would like to wish all of our residents a wonderful Christmas and New Year. They hope that by following the tips below, a more natural and sustainable time can be had by all.




- 1. Wildlife Christmas treats Buy edible Christmas wreaths. See birds up close, including species that are only around in winter.
- **2. Bring nature inside** Why buy Christmas decorations? Make your own from what you can find. Leave plenty for wildlife.
- **3. Gift a wilder future** Purchase wildlife sponsorship, gift memberships, books, clothing and more.
- 4. Ask for donations to environmental and wildlife charities instead of gifts.
- 5. Wrap responsibly Avoid non-recyclable wrapping paper and cards. Buy brown paper and decorate it potato stamping is great fun! Use twine not sticky tape or reuse ribbons from gifts given to you. Give reusable options boxes, bags or fabric wrapping (called 'furoshiki').
- 6. Reuse or replant Christmas trees Buy pre-loved instead of new ones to minimise plastic. Buy potted real trees to replant and use year-on-year.
- 7. Shop small and local Minimise food miles and waste.
- 8. Support wildlife when shopping Organisations like Lancashire Wildlife Trust and Give as you Live include charitable donations for your purchases.
- **9. Cook sustainably** Plan meals ahead and use leftovers. Minimise food waste. Compost vegetable waste. Avoid foods with unnecessary packaging to reduce your carbon footprint.




