VETERANS IN COMMUNITIES

A CLEVERLY crafted half-scale model of a First World War tank is being constructed on the gateway into Rossendale from Rochdale.

Ex-serviceman David Joddrell is creating the living sculpture from willow on the main road at Healey Corner.

Because the willow is alive it will continue to grow throughout the summer and the trees' branches will be continuously woven into the structure making it more solid.

David was an armourer in the Royal Electrical Mechanical Engineers and was based in Germany and Cyprus and had two tours in Northern Ireland.

Whitworth Neighbourhood Forum allocated a grant to Veteran In Communities for the project, which is part Operation 100 (Bacup War Graves).

It will see works completed in Whitworth Memorial Gardens.

David, 62, from Bacup, said: "I am creating a First World War Mark 4 male tank. It will have a gun sponson on either side, which will hold a cannon, and there will also be a willow machine gun at the front.

"I have deliberately left the back of the tank open so that children will be able to go inside it.

You may remember going to Mount Pleasant for a meal or even recall when the Pallotine nuns were there but did you know that during World War 1 it was used as an auxiliary military hospital.

"With wife and mother faraway

Who cares for Tommy's wants all day?

Ask any ma, you'll hear him say---

"Our Matron"

These lines were written by Gunner N Jackson, 3rd Battalion 1st Brigade Canadian Field Artillery trying to express his gratitude for the care he received.

This is one of 150 entries in an autograph book for the period 1 May 1917 to 23 January 1918 by injured servicemen from all over the British Isles, Ireland, America and Canada covering 71 regiments.

At the end of the war, the book was presented to the matron in question - Miss Nora Welsh, daughter of the local G.P. Dr Alexander Welsh.

Following her death at 96 in 1981 her nephew Norman Forbes presented the book to the museum where it is on display.



Michael was in the Acorn Recovery Projects accommodation recovering from substance misuse issues and was subject to a debt relief order. Officers from Rossendale Borough Council are helping with the organisation of the project. To donate to the project, make a cheque payable to Whitworth Town Council.





ANNUAL REPORT

MAYOR'S OVERVIEW

The year just past has, as always, been a busy and productive one for the Town Council. As Mayor and Consort, my husband Peter and I have been invited to attend a huge number of events both within the town and in neighbouring boroughs, and I'm delighted that we managed to attend the vast majority of invitations received, all of which were most enjoyable. We've enjoyed visiting groups and establishments within Whitworth and also spreading the 'Whitworth Word' further afield into neighbouring boroughs. As reported by previous Mayors, I too can confirm that Whitworth is highly regarded and envied by its neighbours.

The Town Council continues to be instrumental in a variety of initiatives, many of which are detailed in the report before you. The Council continues to provide a strong, unique service to the town, and I am delighted and relieved that, through much discussion and prudent financial management, the Council has again managed to keep its precept at the same level for the fourth year running. Over and above core duties, the Town Council works with other councils and agency organisations, such as the Police and Green Vale Homes, and with residents and businesses to get the best for our town and its residents. The Town Council, more often than not, leads on these discussions and our Clerk facilitates numerous meetings throughout the year. The Town Council also continues to uphold the rights and values of the town in its role as a pressure group and a sounding board for local opinion.

There is a strong sporting community within our town and we have an enviable amount and variety of sporting and leisure activities available all year round. The Tourism and Leisure Committee and the Sports Council both continue to provide events and festivals, working with other local organisations, often on a voluntary basis. We are also extremely fortunate to have such a wonderful voluntary sector in our town, from the band to the horticultural society - the Town Council sends grateful thanks to all who strive to make Whitworth a better place to live.

Personal highlights - I have met some wonderful dedicated people, attended spectacular charity events, visited Blackburn Cathedral, spent time with 'The Accrington Pals,' and lit a candle at the Springhill Hospice's lights of love service, but for me the most special time is when the Chain of Office is invited into the heart of Whitworth, meeting the children and families at the friends of Wallbank's Christmas Party, handing out the Easter eggs at Hall Fold Playgroup, announcing the winners of the Knobbly Knees and Glamorous Granny competitions at the Family Fun day, and of course getting wet through at the annual Duck Race.

Looking forward, I am sure that Councillor Mellor will do a thorough and inspiring job as Mayor when he takes over the reigns later this month, and I send him all my very best wishes for what has proved to be a most enjoyable, humbling and privileged of experiences. In the months ahead, the Town Council will no doubt be given some challenges, not least the ongoing squeeze on finances, and will also be providing the community with further events and initiatives. The Town Council's staff and councillors remain committed to seeing the community through these challenging times and are very much looking forward to the year ahead.

INITIATIVES

The Council is supported by Town Clerk Karen Douglas, who works 30 hours a week as standard. The Council also contracts a Parish Lengthsman for general repairs and maintenance. The Lengthsman's hours have been reduced slightly for the year ahead, however he will continue to complete jobs throughout the year such as attending to Public Rights of Way, mending foothpaths, fences and stiles and undertaking a multitude of jobs in and around the town. The Council has also seen a reduction in funding from the Borough Council for the fulltime Town Caretaker position, but, with careful financial management . has managed to keep the position full time for the year ahead. The Town Caretaker litter-picks targeted sites the length and breadth of the town, and reports issues and problems back to the Clerk. All three maintain healthy attendance sheets - a testament to their professionalism and commitment to the town.

The Town Council's website, www.whitworth.gov.uk, is well used and an asset to the Council. The site aims to be a one-stop-shop for Whitworth information for residents and visitors, and is updated by the Town Clerk. The past year saw a full redevelopment of the site, making it more user-friendly and easier to update, and incorporating new technologies. The Town Council also makes good use of social media and its Facebook page is regularly contributed to.

The Horticultural Society continues to do a wonderful job ensuring the town looks its blooming best. The Society works proactively with the Town, Borough and County councils, and is financially supported in part by the Town Council – a good illustration of the Council interacting with the community. The volunteers tend to flowerbeds and the planter boxes provided by Northern Joinery Ltd, and last year also saw the official re-opening of the refurbished Memorial Gardens, following a successful \$50kbid to Community Spaces.

The Town Council-produced quarterly Whitworth Valley News magazine continues to be a very popular read, receiving editorial contributions from a wide variety of organisations and featuring over 88 paying advertisers. It involves a significant amount of work for the Clerk but is very well received and ensures all in Whitworth are up-todate with town news and developments. In its 10th year now, it is hand-delivered to all households by the Sports Council. The Town Council contributes towards the fight against crime with the continued sponsorship of the Whitworth community police car, which has proved invaluable to the local constabulary, and with the Speed Indication Device, which has had some success in lowering speeds in problem areas of the town.

The Town Council works in partnership with Rossendale and Lancashire Councils and other local organisations including Lancashire Police and Green Vale Homes to provide the best possible services for the Whitworth community. To give examples, the Town Council facilitates monthly Multi-Agency meetings, where representatives of all the main agencies come together to tackle issues in the town, and holds quarterly meetings with the County Council's Highways department. The Town Council continues to take a pro-active approach to tackling the issue of litter and uncollected dog-mess, supporting the legislative work undertaken by the Borough Council, issuing further letters to residents around particular 'grot-spot' areas.

The Town Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee, featuring councillor and non-councillor members. organises or part-organises a large number of events annually - this past year's offer has included the Rushcart, Christmas Lights Switch On, New Year's Duck Race, St George Celebrations, Family Fun Day and the Whitworth Calendar, which sold 140 copies - all these events and initiatives have been provided for less than £647 in total. The Committee is currently working on all these projects again, along with the fourth Whitworth Scarecrow Festival which takes place in early summer. Additionally, the Town Council itself is responsible for organising Whitworth's Remembrance Sunday commemorations and the Community (Civic) Carol Service (see below). All these events serve to preserve and strengthen the town's identity and provide a solid sense of community and civic pride.

Comprising town councillors and representatives of local sporting organisations, the Whitworth Sports Council continues to flourish, and plans for the 2014 Sports Festival are well underway. Last year's June's Sports Festival went off well, with a successful come-and-join-in opening day on the High School field, several new events, some great support from outside organisations such as Rossendale Leisure Trust, Rochdale Hornets and Climb Rochdale, and lots of enthusiasm from people across Whitworth, especially the children and staff of the four junior schools.

TOWN TWINNING

The friendship between Whitworth and Kandel continues - during October a delegation of 25 adults and 3 children from Kandel visited Whitworth for eight days. The delegates stayed with 14 Whitworth families and a full programme was organised for their visit.

Visits to Chester, Castle Howard, Blackpool Illuminations and Rochdale Town Hall and Touchstones were combined with events in Whitworth that included Welcome and Farewell functions, a Band Concert by the Whitworth Vale and Healey Brass Band and the Mayor of Whitworth's 60's themed Charity Evening. Whitworth has been twinned with Kandel for almost 48 years and a delegation of 19 adults from Whitworth will visit Kandel for eight days in July this year. Cllrs Aldred and Mellor are instrumental in keeping the twinning alive, and thanks are due to them for their continued work.

CIVIC EVENTS

2013's municipal year began as always with Mayor-Making followed by Civic Sunday, both at the Riverside. Rev Lyn Woodall of St Bartholomew's and St John's Churches has acted as Mayoral Chaplain this year and many thanks are offered to her for her support. As always, the Town Council-organised Remembrance Sunday commemorations were extremely well attended, as was the schools Armistace day event on Monday 11 November, which was organised by St John with St Michael Primary and also attended by St Anselms children. The Civic Carol Service at the Riverside was led by Rev Lyn Woodall and also a very popular event; the junior band did a sterling job accompanying the carols and a joyful, festive time was had by all. The Charity Ball in April was an enjoyable evening, with food provided by Lords the Caterers and featuring live musical entertainment. Dignitaries from other Councils attended the event, and money was raised for the Mayor's Charity Fund.

PLANNING

As a statutory planning consultee, the Town Council passes comments on all Whitworth applications; Rossendale Borough Council then takes these observations into account when reaching planning decisions. Since April 2013, 26 applications have been considered by the Town Council, ranging from home extensions to the redevelopment of former mill sites. The Town Council is also consulted on Highways proposals and other consultations which relate to, or affect the Whitworth area.

CONCLUSION

Whitworth Town Council continues to serve its community well. The Council continues to be as accessible as possible – the magazine, website, social media and email service ensure communication is efficient and easy, and the public have good accessibility to the Council via the Town Clerk or by direct contact with Councillors. The Town Council's relationships with Rossendale and Lancashire Councils and with other local organisations ensure that improvements continue to be made and problems are monitored and dealt with. On a lighter note, the Town Council provides and supports a range of fun, family events and initiatives throughout the year. There will, as always, be challenges and opportunities presented over the year ahead; the Town Council is well equipped to deal with both.


