

WRESTLER EDWARD 'TEDDY' LOWE

Whitworth museum regularly receives requests for information and assistance about the history of the valley and its inhabitants. The majority relate to relatives who lived in the area but have long since passed away or, for various reasons, moved out of the locality. Recently, a request for information was received, via Facebook, from an American researcher living in Delaware, Ohio whose interest is the history of wrestling, in particular, one Whitworth athlete by the name of Edward 'Teddy' Lowe. Whilst there are several references to 'Teddy' on various websites, little seems to exist about his life in the valley itself. An article from Rochdale Observer of 27th October 1877 reads about three thousand persons assembled at the Higginshaw Grounds, near Oldham, to witness a Lancashire wrestling match, the best two out of three back falls, "catch as catch can," between Edward Lowe, of Whitworth, near Rochdale, and Francis Robinson, of Ashton-under-Lyne, for £25 a side and the Higginshaw challenge cup, now held by Lowe.

Is it possible that a reader of this magazine knows something of 'Teddy's' past? If so, the museum would be pleased to receive any information on the subject.

The Heritage Museum on North Street is open throughout the year on Tuesday evenings 7.30 - 9.30pm and on Saturday afternoons 2.00 - 4.00pm.



Please note that in order to become an attorney or deputy for a family member or friend who has already lost the mental capacity to make their ow decisions, an application to the Court of Protection would need to be undertaken which is very expensive with costs of sometimes over £1,000.

Our prices for Wills have remained the same as when we first began trading in 2008, which is £60 plus VAT for a single Will or £100 plus VAT for a couple making similar Wills.

Our price for an uncontested divorce with financial aspects agreed between the parties is a fixed fee of £450 plus VAT and the court fee of £550.00.

Please note that the grant will be awarded on a first come, first served basis to suitable premises in each area of the town. Should the allocation reach the full capacity in your area, your details will be put down on a waiting list to take part in the scheme in the future, subject to funding being available.



WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL PRECEPT 2017/2018

Whitworth Town Council has this year set a net budget of £58,592. The Council has worked hard to keep the increase in precept to a minimum, which has been difficult in the current financial climate.

This past year has seen some pressures on finances and significant increases in costs, but some decent savings have been made in various areas of the budget to off-set this. Additionally, the Town Council's wise investments are providing a healthy dividend. The Council is never complacent, however, and continues to strive to increase income and reduce spending wherever possible. Expenditure includes salaries for the Town Clerk (30 hours), our full-time Whitworth Town Caretaker, who makes a significant impact on the town's cleanliness, and our Parish Lengthsman, who tackles repairs and general maintenance around the town.

The recently improved Town Council website attracts good visitor numbers, and the Town Council utilises social media to encourage a two-way dialogue with the community. The Valley News magazine, produced quarterly by the Town Council, continues to be hugely popular, and the Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee has a variety of leisure and cultural events planned for the year ahead. The Town Council continues to promote Whitworth as a great place to live, and lobbies hard for the best possible services for the town. It is at the forefront of tackling crime through the sponsorship of the Police Community Support Vehicle, and facilitates monthly multi-agency meetings attended by all the local agencies. From April 2017, Whitworth Town Council are investing in a new Community Toilet Scheme, working alongside local business' to improve the facilities in our town.

To conclude, the Town Council continues to be proud of its achievements, and looks forward to working with and for the people of Whitworth during the forthcoming financial year.




