### WHITWORTH'S NEW YEAR'S DAY DUCK RACE AN EGG-CITING SUCCESS

A popular event in the Whitworth calendar, the ducks took to the water at the overflow of Cowm Reservoir on Tong. 1,560 ducks were sponsored and around 500 people turned out on the day in this growing event.

The ducks were launched at 1pm by Whitworth Councillor David Chorlton, Chair of the Tourism and Leisure Committee, with support from committee member Les Hirst. The sponsor of the first duck (1206) over the line was Sheila Dearden who won £100, with second place (1044) being taken by Holly Atkin with a prize of £75 and third prize (961) of £50 issued to Debbie Gowans. The last duck (603) to waddle in was sponsored by Jack Foster who was awarded a tenner.

The Duck Race is organised jointly between Tourism and Leisure Committee and CLAW (the Community Leisure Association of Whitworth). All proceeds are ploughed back into tourism and leisure events for the town organised by the two organisations. This year the duck race raised over a thousand pounds to be split between the two organisations and used for the Whitworth community.

For those unfamiliar with the concept, numbered ducks sponsored for a pound are entered into the Duck Race, and those who have sponsored the numbers of the first three ducks (and the last one) over the line get a cash prize.

### WHITWORTH DOCTORS

Even after 250 years the local museum here in Whitworth continues to receive objects and documents relating to the valley's unique story of the Whitworth Doctors. Members of the Taylor family first came to Whitworth around 1764, first as blacksmiths and farriers but later as the resident medical practitioners. Recently, the museum was gifted an accounts book which dates from the 1830's and which details the supply of various pills, potions and medicines to residents of the village as well as regular visits to those patients too ill to attend surgery. This book indicates, perhaps surprisingly, that bleeding and bloodletting was still regularly taking place at

that time. Medical thinking, dating from the time of the Greek physician Hippocrates, around 390BC, suggests that illness is caused by an imbalance in the make-up of bodily fluids. It was thought these fluids, often referred to as the 'Four Humors' and comprising of blood, yellow bile, phlegm and black bile could be re-balanced by the removal of blood from the body. The book tells us that on 3rd December 1835, 'Widow' Mills of Broadley was charged 6d (around £15 today) for 'bleeding'. The book is on permanent display at Whitworth Museum.



### **SKYLINE WALK**

This year's Skyline walk takes place on Sunday May 17. Walkers leave Lobden Golf Club between 8 and 9am, walking a circle of the moors around Whitworth at their own pace, returning for a bite to eat at the Golf Club. This year's direction is clockwise, meaning walkers get a downhill start then go up Rooley Moor Road. For those wanting something shorter than the full 14 miles, there are two options – the 9-mile Western Skyline to Britannia; or the 3-mile Skyline Sunday Stroll, which concludes at

the foot of Rooley Moor Road. Entry forms are available from the start of April, or you can enter via the Town Council website (50p extra that way).

The event needs volunteers to act as checkpoint marshals and backmarkers. The marshals form static teams to offer reassurance to walkers and keep a tally for safety purposes. Backmarkers walk a 3-mile section of the course, slowly, at the very back of the walkers to ensure the organisers don't lose anybody, collecting up marker flags, and giving marshals a clear signal that they can close their checkpoint. ## WHITWORTH ROADWORKS UPDATE

Town councillors and members of the public have been complaining recently to Lancashire County Council about the state of the road surface on Market Street throughout the length of Whitworth. The road was fully resurfaced last summer but started to break up not long after and the current state is poor.

Lancashire Highways have confirmed that the surface is unsatisfactory, and that the contractor will not receive payment until the issue is rectified. They have instructed the contractor to resurface the road again but this will have to wait until the weather improves. In the meantime they have agreed to provide regular street sweeping until the resurfacing is complete.

There are also plans to make repairs to the broken drains under the pedestrian crossing on Market Street near Tong Lane. This area has flooded regularly for several years and they are now able to make repairs and resolve the problem. There will be an inevitable knock on effect for traffic during the works and apologies are given for any disruption.

# WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL PRECEPT 2020/2021

Whitworth Town Council has this year set a net budget of £60,6266. The Council has worked hard to keep the increase in precept to a minimum, which has been difficult in the current financial climate and in the face of further cuts to the Council Tax Support Grant from the Borough Council.

This past year has seen some pressures on finances and significant increases in costs, but some decent savings have been made in various areas of the budget to off-set this and the Town Council's wise investments are providing a healthy dividend. The Council is facing tough times in the next few years as we are expecting further cuts from the borough, so we strive to increase income and reduce spending wherever possible. Expenditure includes salaries for the Town Clerk (30 hours), our full-time Whitworth Town Caretaker, who makes a significant impact on the town's cleanliness, and our Parish Lengthsman, who tackles repairs and general maintenance around the town and also a member of staff who opens the toilets at weekends.

The Town Council utilises social media and their website to encourage a two-way dialogue with the community. The Valley News magazine, produced quarterly, continues to be hugely popular, and the Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee has a variety of leisure

and cultural events planned for the year ahead. The Town Council continues to promote Whitworth as a great place to live, and lobbies hard for the best possible services for the town. It is at the forefront of tackling crime through the sponsorship of the Police Community Support Vehicle and facilitates monthly multimeetings attended agency by all the local agencies. For the last three years, the council have been running a successful Community Toilet Scheme, working alongside local businesses to improve the facilities in our town.

To conclude, the Town Council continues to be proud of its achievements and looks forward to working with and for the people of Whitworth during the forthcoming financial year.
