# **Whitworth Rushcart procession**

Whitworth Rushcart will take place on Sunday 4 September. The procession leaves Whitworth Museum at 1.00pm featuring traditional morris dance troupes and will travel up the main road, led by the Rushcart itself towards the Ashcroft. From 1.15pm until 4.30pm, the car park of The Ashcroft will be cordoned off for stalls, entertainments, and performances from various morris dancing troupes and members of the Whitworth Vale and Healey Band. The Ashcroft bar will be open for liquid refreshments and there will be a variety of food available. There will also be an Arts and Craft Fair in the Ashcroft main hall.



The Whitworth Rushcart is one of only four such celebrations which still take place in the UK. Whitworth's cart is unique in that it is the only one in the UK to be covered in beautiful local heather that is in bloom at this time of year, collected by the Whitworth Rushcart Men from the moors above Darwen before the event; Rushcarts in the other areas are covered with rushes or tatters of cloth. BUT! Organisers need help! For the procession to go ahead smoothly, we need the help of 22 volunteer marshals to assist the traffic management company by directing traffic away from side streets. # **Christmas Trees on Brackets**

Whitworth Tourism and Leisure Committee are aiming to extend the Christmas lights offer across the length of the town by installing Christmas trees, at a subsidised cost to properties around Whitworth. To spread the festive cheer throughout the village, the Committee is hoping that you might consider displaying a Christmas tree on your property this year. The Committee can offer the following: A 3ft to 4ft real Christmas tree plus a set of mains-

powered or battery festive lights, including installation and removal. The cost of fuel and other materials has risen significantly this year and we anticipate the cost of trees this year will be £50 per tree. The tree would be taken away at the end of the festive season. Trees would be installed between Monday 14th November and Sunday 27th November, the contractor would need to arrange access for the mains cable to be fed into the house.

# **Update from your MP**

Back in June, Jake Berry MP held his latest Meet Your MP event in Whitworth at the brilliant new café, Market Street Kitchen. He was joined by County Councillor Scott Smith for a Q&A with Whitworth residents about the issues affecting them.

A lively discussion took place on everything from road repairs and bus services, to cattle grids and scrambler bikes. Residents were rightly concerned about persistent speeding along Market Street, causing a danger to other motorists and pedestrians.

Jake and Scott are continuing to work closely with Lancashire County Council, to ensure all the speed cameras along Market Street are active. And they're pushing Rossendale Police to deploy some of their 19 new officers to the area, to act as deterrent and take enforcement action against anyone breaking the law.

To enable more police action, it's vital that residents who see speeding report it to the police via the 101 non-emergency line or on the website.

Jake and Scott are following up on all the issues raised with Rossendale Borough Council and Lancashire County Council and are feeding back to those who attended. You can always contact Jake on jake.berry.mp@parliament.uk or by calling 01706 215 547 if you have any issue of concern.

Whitworth's **two Community Galleries** will soon complete a first post-covid year of exhibitions. Pupils of St John with St Michael School currently have Platinum Jubilee artwork on display at the Library. The Whitworth branch of University of the Third Age will be showing what they do at the Leisure Centre from September 2; with a celebration of Whitworth Rushcart following on September 23. From October 14, will be a fascinating exhibition of photos and changing images tracking the building of the new Whitworth High School; and Whitworth Valley FC will complete the autumn schedule from November 4. All those exhibitions will transfer to the Library after their three weeks at the Baths. There are still one or two gaps in the schedule for the next twelve months. # **Whitworth Play Area Update**

The new play space is almost finished. As we know, the timescales for this project slipped because of Covid, Brexit delays and then terrible weather, but we're thrilled that it's now all coming together. Work to tackle weeds and non-native plants around the site will continue over the next couple of weeks, and the finishing touches will be done by local primary school children who will plant wildflower bulbs.

Children from both Tonacliffe and St Bartholomews Schools worked with artist Rick Goodwin of Stump Art to design and create two beautiful bespoke seats, carved from oak using chainsaws. One depicts local wildlife and the other tells the industrial story of the site. Unfortunately, vandals attacked the seats one weekend in July and have caused significant damage.

This project is for the whole community and has had input from children and the community at each stage – to see all that hard work get damaged in just a few short hours is really upsetting for the whole community. We would like to ask families, dog walkers and those using the site to please be vigilant and to

# Commissioner wants your views on anti-social behaviour

Lancashire's Police and Crime Commissioner Andrew Snowden has launched a county wide antisocial behaviour survey to get a full picture of the scale and types of anti-social behaviour (ASB), to identify hotspots and to look at how the police and local partners can work better together.



Commissioner Snowden said: "ASB can take many forms including intimidating and aggressive groups, drug dealing in residential areas, damage, graffiti, and the anti-social use of vehicles. What they all have in common is that they are a blight on our communities and make people feel unsafe in their homes and on the streets. ASB is one of the top concerns raised with Lancashire police and an issue that residents write to me about every day.

Results from the survey will be independently evaluated and shared with a range of partners including the police, local councils, housing associations and other partners through Lancashire's Community Safety Partnerships to form a joined-up response to tackling anti-social behaviour across the county.

Whitworth Men's Shed is a community project for men of all ages. A social space where men can come and get involved in practical activities or have a chat with other guys over a brew. New members always welcome!




