COMMUNITY DEFIBRILLATORS FOR ROSSENDALE (CDFR)

Community Defibrillators for Rossendale (CDfR) are delighted to announce that, thanks to a grant from the Crook Hill Community Benefit Fund, they have been able to install a Community Public Access Defibrillator (cPAD) on the outside wall of The Riverside office, Whitworth Civic Hall. This is to enable rapid deployment of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in a cardiac arrest emergency.

AEDs are especially designed to enable people with no medical background to assist a victim of Sudden Cardiac Arrest, in the crucial first few minutes. Chances of survival are significantly improved if action is taken quickly. Having a cPAD available could, ultimately, save lives.

Community Defibs for Rossendale was formed to encourage local communities to install these units in their own area. Whitworth can be challenging for ambulances to arrive within the vital minutes required to make a difference in a Cardiac Arrest situation and Riverside is a hub of the town with sport and social provision for residents and visitors of all ages.

The scheme is supported by the North-West Ambulance Service NHS Trust and Rossendale Community First Responders.

A HISTORY OF LANCASHIRE IN 70 OBJECTS

Lancashire Museum Service is currently running a project through which a unique history of Lancashire is to be projected by featuring 70 objects displayed in various Lancashire museums. (It will also run as a series in Lancashire Life). One contributor is our very own local museum in North Street. Starting in September and running for three months, Whitworth Museum will present a feature exhibition focused upon the Whitworth Doctors. The Taylors were originally trained as farriers and became famous as early as the 1750's for treatment of bone fractures in both animal and

human patients. The Doctors were also known for their radical approach to curing, or at least treating, certain cancers. Such fame travelled quickly and even reached the attention of King George III whose daughter, Princess Elizabeth, had confounded the court physicians with a ".... condition of the head". Although details of the cure are vague, the Doctors' reputation appears to have been upheld and two other notable clients, Thomas Thurlow, then Bishop of Durham and Archibald Campbell Tait, later to become Archibshop of Canterbury, also became patients. Despite these high profile clients, the Taylors never forgot the animals on which their reputation had been founded.

Whitworth Museum is open throughout the year on Tuesday evenings 7.30 – 9.30pm and on Saturdays 2.00 – 4.00pm.

Once a person has lost mental capacity, and cannot understand the process of applying for a Power of Attorney, it is then too late to do it. Our fees for doing a Power of Attorney and registering it, are £225 plus VAT and the registration fee of £110.

Please note that in order to become an attorney or deputy for a family member or friend who has already lost the mental capacity to make their own decisions, an application to the Court of Protection would need to be undertaken which is very expensive with costs of sometimes over £1,000.

Our prices for Wills have remained the same as when we first began trading in 2008, which is £60 plus VAT for a single Will or £100 plus VAT for a couple making similar Wills.

Our price for an uncontested divorce with financial aspects agreed between the parties is a fixed fee of £450 plus VAT and the court fee of £550.00.
