



Whitworth Museum, sponsored by Green Vale Homes, has commenced a pilot project which seeks to provide a series of Memory Boxes. Included in the boxes are various everyday items, some from the relatively recent times, others from sixty or so years ago, which, it is hoped, will trigger long held memories and stimulate conversation between parties. The effects of dementia can be extremely isolating for those involved but conversation and stimulus can provide a welcome form of release. Although intended for use within independent living schemes both to help create conversation and ease

## WHITWORTH SKYLINE WALK

**This Sunday it's SKYLINE!** Whitworth's very own community challenge walk kicks off this Sunday, 15th May, between 8 and 9am from Lobden Golf Club. The first two Skyline walks attracted over 300 walkers each – can we make it 400 this year?

Come and have a great day out on the hills. If you've walked Skyline before you'll know the drill – the biggest change this year is the anti-clockwise direction. If you haven't, and you're reading this on Wednesday or before, you can still fill in an entry form at the Leisure Centre, The Riverside, UBS or Jan's cafe and hand over your £3. You can still enter on Thursday, Friday or Saturday (but only at UBS or the Leisure

Centre, and it'll be £5 then). Alternatively, you can enter on the day for £5, by turning up at Lobden Golf Club between 8 and 9am – please note no dogs can be taken on the walk: sorry. If you do this, please make sure you're well kitted out – walking boots or the equivalent, waterproofs (at least to carry), and at least one layer of clothing more than you think you're going to need, because it's always cooler and windier on the tops.

The 14 miles will take you, probably, between 5 and 8 hours, so bring a snack or two, and a drink, although there will be juice/water available to you at each checkpoint (roughly every 3 miles), a burger van en route and a meal at the finish back at the Golf Club. Checkpoint 2 is on the main road at Britannia at 5 miles, so if you know the full 14 is going to be beyond you, how about walking just those first 5 miles, which we're calling the Eastern Skyline, and calling it quits? (If you tell us on your entry form that this is what you're going to do, we'll lop a pound off your entry fee. You'll still get your certificate: and your meal, if you go back to Lobden.)

# COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

ROSSENDALE's busy team of award winning Community First Responders save lives and care for people across the Valley by supporting the North West Ambulance Service. Established in 2003, the Rossendale team is one of the busiest in the North West, covering a large rural area of 53 square miles and 70,000 people.

Additional volunteer Responders are being sought for Whitworth. All Responders must commit to full training, organised by the North West Ambulance Service, which includes a final assessment by paramedics. No previous first aid knowledge is necessary but commitment is required.

Responders are needed to provide cover during the day, in the evening and at weekends, with flexibility for each volunteer to work to their availability. They have training meetings every fortnight. There is a good camaraderie between the Responders and always a bit of banter.

## SPODDEN VALLEY GRASSLANDS

An important stepping stone to help bees and other pollinating insects to recover from decades of decline, is being restored by volunteers in Whitworth.

The Lancashire Wildlife Trust's Spodden Valley Grasslands Project, run by Rebecca Witcombe is working to restore and extend meadows that lie to the north of Healey Dell LNR.

Restoration of the Spodden Valley grasslands complement the work that the South Pennines Grasslands Project, lead by Phil Reddell, has been carrying out along the old railway line, including cutting and clearing small areas of grassland.

A team of volunteers from the Whitworth area worked with Rebecca and Phil on two sunny days in February to clear scrub back off the meadows.

This work enabled a local farmer to come in and cut the meadows in preparation for the wildflower planting activities planned for this spring and summer. Activities coming up:

- Plug planting and seed sowing May
- Mapping invasive species May
- Wildflower ID July
- Plug planting and seeding August

Whitworth Children's Centre is supporting Whitworth Businesses to support Breastfeeding Mum's on their premises. Breastfeeding Friendly Places is an important element of the UNICEF 'Baby Friendly Initiative'

New mothers in East Lancashire tell us that they feel more relaxed visiting public premises that display the "Welcome to Breastfeed here" logo, as it gives out an encouraging and supportive message. It reassures mothers that they need not feel anxious or embarrassed about breastfeeding their baby when out in public, in turn this scheme helps to reduce a potential barrier to breastfeeding by protecting and advocating a mother's legal right to breastfeed in public places (as detailed in the Equality Act 2010).

You may have seen Children's Centre Manager Tracy Johnson and Outreach Worker Elaine Brett out and about visiting local businesses. They have been overwhelmed by the Whitworth Business community in supporting the Baby Friendly Initiative, contributing to the Health and Wellbeing of the Whitworth Children.

## **NEW COMMUNITY FUND AWARDS FIRST GRANTS**

Thirteen highly deserving local projects are celebrating being awarded grants through the new Crook Hill Community Benefit Fund. The successful projects have each received a share of £35,000.

The largest award went to Whitworth Valley Football Club who have been awarded £10,000 to improve the infrastructure at the Rawstron Street football ground. Other projects in Whitworth sharing the wind fall include Whitworth Vale and Healey Band, Whitworth 41st Scout Group and Whitworth Community Choir.

Funding was also awarded to the 25th anniversary Rushbearing Festival and the annual Food and Drink Festival both of which take place in Littleborough during the summer. Wardle village also had a number of successful projects with the Scout troop, Wardle Football Club and Wardle Recreation Ground all being selected to receive grant support. Hare Hill House Community Hub was also awarded over £4,000 to assist in repairing the roof and the Incredible Edible Farm in Todmorden will soon have a community Nano Dairy thanks to a grant of £3,500.

# WHITWORTH NEWS – FLOODING UPDATE

## ROSSENDALE FLOOD RESILIENCE FUND

A fund of £5000 is available for businesses and home owners affected by flooding during the recent storms Desmond and Eva. The fund is intended to help protect buildings from future flooding, by preventing water from getting in or by limiting the damage caused where flooding is unavoidable.

For insured property: If your property is insured, your insurer may have assessed ways to build resilience into the repair work. Insurers won't pay for this work as it is considered 'Betterment', and the Resilience Fund could meet the additional cost.

For uninsured property: If your property is uninsured, you can still apply for the Resilience Fund, providing evidence of how the fund will support your property to become more resilient to flooding. Where a survey is required, this can be funded as part of the £5,000.

Rented accommodation: The fund can be accessed by landlords, providing evidence of how it will be used in each specific property.

Collective applications: Where groups, such as a street of properties who have been affected by flooding would like to work together to develop a solutions, such as adaptations to infrastructure, there is potential for the fund to support this.

You can apply for the fund retrospectively, and where it is agreed that measures have provided additional resilience, funds will be allocated. All applications should be submitted by the 31st December 2016.

# WHY DOESN'T FLOOD INSURANCE FUND COVER SMALL BUSINESSES?

On December 26th a number of small businesses in the beautiful Rossendale Valley in Lancashire got flooded, these businesses are the heart beat of their local communities.

Sadly- the insurance industry scheme starting in April 2016 that ensures that domestic dwellings can get insurance at a fair price even if they have a high flood risk-is not open to small businesses.

David Broadbent MD of Northern Joinery commented "We have been flooded 3 times in the last 8 years and most recently on Boxing Day- we cannot get flood insurance and we must self insure. This is putting our business at risk and more importantly the livelihood of the 50 families that rely on our company".

Simon Macaulay of the Whitworth Flood Forum says:

"We think more serious flooding is here to stay — Northern Joinery and Anglo recycling are responsible businesses and are happy to bear their share of the burden by building greater resilience to flooding (e.g. electric points higher off the ground and stock held on racking at a higher level) but in return we think these businesses should be allowed to enter the insurance industry's scheme and receive the offer of a fair price for insurance against future flooding- just as householders do".

Following months of planning, the annual Whitworth Rushcart celebrations will take place in the town on the afternoon of Sunday 4 September 2016. This is a family friendly event and all are welcome. The procession will leave from North Street car park, off Market Street, Whitworth, at 1.00pm. Featuring numerous traditional morris dance troupes, the Rushcart procession will travel north up the main road, arriving at The Riverside at approximately 1.20pm. The procession will be led by the Rushcart itself.

From 1.15pm until 4.30pm, the car park of the Civic Hall will be cordoned off for stalls, entertainments, and performances, plus the Whitworth Vale and Healey Youth Band. St Bartholomew's Church will be providing traditional hot food, and the Riverside bar will be open for liquid refreshments, including real ale named 'Grogan's Delight' in memory of the late Jimmy Grogan, Honorary Townsman of Whitworth.

The Whitworth Rushcart is one of only four such celebrations which still take place in the UK, the others being in Sowerby Bridge, Littleborough and Saddleworth. Whitworth's cart is unique in that it is the only one in the UK to be covered in beautiful local heather that is in bloom at this time of year, collected by

the Whitworth Rushcart Men from the moors above Darwen before the event; Rushcarts in the other areas are covered with rushes or tatters of cloth. Whitworth's Rushcart history goes back hundreds of years; initially the celebration was linked into the cutting and collection of rushes to be strewn on the bare earth or stone flagged floor of the church as a form of insulation for the winter to come, taken to the church on the cart. Out of this grew a celebration which was enjoyed by the whole community.





# ANNUAL REPORT, WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL

## **MAYOR'S OVERVIEW**

Time certainly flies when you're having fun, as they say—I can scarcely believe that it is a full twelve months since the last Annual Parish meeting. As Mayor and Consort, David and I have had a wonderful, fulfilling, privileged time—we've been invited to attend well over 100 events in Whitworth and further afield and have managed to get to all but a handful of them. My personal highlights include the Remembrance commemorations in November, I was astonished and humbled by the numbers of people who turned out to pay their respects on Remembrance Sunday. I have also hugely enjoyed chairing the meetings of the town council and I thank the members of the public who have also attended our meetings to raise issues or concerns.

This document as a whole details the work not just of the Town Council but of some of the organisations and charities that work tirelessly, many on a voluntary basis, to improve Whitworth and make it a great place to live. It never ceases to amaze me how a relatively small town can have so much taking place within it, and so many devoted, hard working members of the community to organise events and initiatives.

The Town Council continues to be at the fore of a variety of initiatives, many of which are detailed in this report; it continues to provide a dedicated service to the town whilst staying within its frugal spending limitations. It is through prudent financial management and much discussion and research that the Council can announce that it has again managed to keep its precept at the same level, with a 0% increase for the sixth year running. Over and above core duties, the Town Council works alongside other councils and agency organisations, such as the Police and Green Vale Homes, and with residents and businesses to get the best for our town and its residents. The Town Council often leads on these discussions and our Clerk facilitates numerous meetings throughout the year. The Town Council also continues to uphold the rights and values of the town in its role as a pressure group and a sounding board for local

Outside of the work of the Town Council, our wonderful community rallies around to make sure that there are a variety of events and initiatives taking place throughout the year. There continues to be a strong interest in sport in Whitworth and we have an enviable amount and variety of sporting and leisure activities available all year round. The Tourism and Leisure Committee and the Sports Council both continue to provide events and festivals, working with other local organisations, often on a voluntary basis. We are also extremely fortunate to have such an active voluntary sector in our town, and the Town Council sends sincere thanks to everyone who strives to make Whitworth a better place to live.

Looking ahead to the next twelve months, Councillor Madeline De Souza will become Mayor, I am sure that Madeline will do a thorough and professional job. There are some exciting projects ahead for Whitworth including great

investment in the Spodden Valley revealed project, funded by Heritage Lottery Fund, this will celebrate our heritage and make a fantastic leisure resource for the future. In the months ahead, the Town Council will make the best of its opportunities and strengths and work its way through any challenges. The Town Council's staff and councillors, as always, remain fully committed and are looking forward to the year to come.

## **INITIATIVES**

The Council is supported by Town Clerk Melanie Hearn, who works 30 hours a week as standard. The Council also contracts a Parish Lengthsman, John Leyland, for general repairs and maintenance, including attending to Public Rights of Way, mending foothpaths, fences and stiles and undertaking a multitude of jobs in and around the town. The Council employs a full-time Town Caretaker which is funded in part by Rossendale Borough Council. Glen Iliff. our Town Caretaker, litter-picks targeted sites the length and breadth of the town, and reports issues and problems to the Clerk. All three maintain healthy attendance sheets. The Town Council's website, www.whitworth.gov.uk, is well used and an asset to the Council. The site aims to be a one-stop-shop for Whitworth information for residents and visitors, and is updated by the Town Clerk. The Town Council also makes good use of social media; its Facebook page is regularly contributed to.

The Horticultural Society continues to do a wonderful job ensuring the town looks its blooming best. The Society works proactively with the Town, Borough and County councils, and is financially supported in part by the Town Council – a good illustration of the Council interacting with the community. The volunteers tend to flowerbeds and the planter boxes provided by Northern Joinery Ltd.

The Town Council-produced quarterly Whitworth Valley News magazine continues to be a very popular read, receiving editorial contributions from a wide variety of organisations and featuring over 62 paying advertisers. It involves a significant amount of work for the Clerk but is very well received and ensures all in Whitworth are up-to-date with town news and developments. A recent change in printing contract has seen the costs of producing the magazine drop significantly. It is hand-delivered to all households by the Sports Council volunteers.

The Town Council contributes towards the fight against crime with the continued sponsorship of the Whitworth community police car, which has proved invaluable to the local constabulary, and which the Town Council recently has currently committed to support for a further two years.

The Town Council works in partnership with Rossendale and Lancashire Councils and other local organisations including Lancashire Police and Green Vale Homes to provide the best possible services for the Whitworth community. To give examples, the Town Council facilitates monthly Multi-Agency meetings, where representatives of all the main agencies come together to tackle issues in the town. The Town Council continues to take a pro-active

approach to tackling the issue of litter and uncollected dogmess, supporting the legislative work undertaken by the Borough Council, issuing further letters to residents around particular 'grot-spot' areas. The Town Council continue to use initiatives like a pavement stencil and accompanying signage in hot spot areas (in partnership with the Borough Council) and stickers issued to homes and businesses requesting people pick up their dog mess.

The Town Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee, featuring councillor and non-councillor members, organises or part-organises a large number of events annually — this past year's offer has included the Rushcart, Christmas Lights Switch On, New Year's Duck Race, St George Celebrations, Family Fun Day and the Whitworth Calendar, which sold 200 copies. The Committee is currently working on all these projects again, along with the sixth Whitworth Scarecrow Festival which takes place in early summer. Additionally, the Town Council itself is responsible for organising Whitworth's Remembrance Sunday commemorations and the Community Carol Service (see below). All these events serve to preserve and strengthen the town's identity and provide a solid sense of community and civic pride.

Comprising town councillors and representatives of local sporting organisations, the Whitworth Sports Council continues to flourish, and plans for the 2016 Sports Festival are well underway.

Since 2007, Whitworth Town Council has held Quality Status, a nationally recognised quality benchmark for parish and town councils. This has now been replaced by the Local Council Award Scheme, which celebrates the successes of the best local councils, and provides a framework to support these councils to improve and develop to meet their full potential. It encourages progression by including three award levels: Foundation, Quality and Quality Gold – Whitworth Town Council has successfully achieved the Foundation level and is now working towards its Quality level.

## **TOWN TWINNING**

Whitworth has been twinned with Kandel for 50 years this year and the friendship between the towns continues - during August 2016 a delegation from Whitworth will visit Kandel for seven days, staying with Kandel families and enjoying a programme of activities in and around the Kandel area.

Cllrs Aldred and Mellor are instrumental in keeping the twinning alive, and thanks are due to them for their continued work; if you wish to get involved with Town Twinning in Whitworth please contact them.

## **CIVIC EVENTS**

2015's municipal year began as always with Mayor-Making held at the Riverside, followed by Civic Sunday at St Bartholomew's Church. Rev Lyn Woodall has acted as Mayoral Chaplain this year and many thanks are offered to her for her support. As always, the Town Council-organised Remembrance Sunday commemorations were extremely well attended. The Community Carol Service at the Riverside

was led by Rev Lyn Woodall and was a very popular event; the junior band did a sterling job accompanying the carols and a joyful, festive time was had by all. The Civic Dinner and Dance last month was an enjoyable evening, with food provided by Lords the Caterers and featuring live musical entertainment from Gemma-Louise Doyle. Dignitaries from other Councils attended the event, and over £365 was raised for the Mayor's Charity Fund.

## **PLANNING**

As a statutory planning consultee, the Town Council passes comments on all Whitworth applications; Rossendale Borough Council then takes these observations into account when reaching planning decisions. Since April 2015, 31 applications have been considered by the Town Council, ranging from home extensions to new developments. The Town Council is also consulted on Highways proposals and other consultations which relate to, or affect the Whitworth area

## CONCLUSION

Whitworth Town Council continues to work to the best of its ability to serve its community. The quality of the council is monitored and ratified through the benchmark council awards scheme, and the feedback from the community is overwhelmingly positive. The Town Council strives to be as accessible as possible, with the magazine and website facilitating communications to the community, and social media and the availability of the town clerk and councillors, along with the publicly attended council meetings, enabling a two-way communication with residents, organisations and businesses. The Town Council works with local organisations and authorities to improve its offer and to enhance the lives of everyone in Whitworth, and to ensure that any issues or problems are monitored and dealt with swiftly. It is always looking for innovative ideas to tackle problems, and initiatives such as the support of the Whitworth police car and the partnership working with Rossendale Council on controlling dog mess and making a real and positive difference to daily lives. On a lighter note, the Town Council continues to provide and support a range of fun, family events and initiatives throughout the year, encouraging community spirit and togetherness. There will, as always, be challenges and opportunities presented over the year ahead, but the Town Council is well equipped to deal with both.



## WHITWORTH AGAINST FRACKING!

An Anti-Fracking Group has been formed in Whitworth following the 14th Onshore Licensing Round in December 2015. Hutton Energy – a petroleum exploration and production company were awarded the licence for the area which covers Rochdale and Whitworth (PEDL SD81) and have made commitments to undertake Seismic Surveys and to drill at least one well.

Tracy Abraham, a resident of Whitworth was concerned about the company's plans to use an unconventional gas extraction technique known as Fracking (short for High Volume Hydraulic Fracturing) and decided to set up a Facebook page to raise awareness in the community.

The intense nature of this shale gas extraction process is associated with much more negative impacts than conventional drilling. These include leaking methane, water contamination, air pollution, radioactive contamination, massive industrialisation of the landscape, worsening climate change and earthquakes. Severe health effects in people and animals are beginning to mount in areas where shale gas extraction is widespread.

The campaign group now meets regularly at the Red Lion in Whitworth Square. Residents are invited to join up and help prevent fracking in the area. The group email address is whitworthagainstfracking@gmail.com or they can be contacted via the Facebook page Whitworth Against Fracking!
