SANTA EXPRESS


Following the huge success of the last two years the committee have decided Santa Express will return to the streets of Whitworth for a third consecutive year!



A VERY SPECIAL ROOF

The roof structure in St John's Church, Facit, is very special indeed.

It is a fine example of a Hammer Beam roof, other examples of which are at Rochdale Town Hall and Westminster Hall in London, where the late Queen Elizabeth II lay in state before her funeral.

A Hammer Beam roof is so designed that its arched, wooden beams dissipate the total weight of the roof sideways to the vertical walls and where it is transferred vertically to the ground. This allows the roof to be built higher than normal,



therefore allowing more light to be transmitted into the building through the East and West leaded windows. The design mimics the Gothic style of structure used in France from the 12th to the 15th centuries, although examples were more used in buildings in this country around the 1870s.

Rochdale Town Hall was built from 1866 to 1869, St John's Church, Facit in 1870.





COMMUNITY CARING FOR COMMUNITY

Like many other foodbanks The Lighthouse Community Foodshare in Whitworth is seeing a worrying increase of people from all walks of life needing its services. Gone are the days when foodbanks mostly saw the homeless or people with addictions – now professionals and families with two working adults are also struggling to make ends meet.



The Lighthouse is proud to help anyone in need but it's becoming more challenging. As shops also tighten their belts to reduce costs they have less surplus food to give to foodbanks. Even with the generosity of the local community over three quarters of the food given to the Lighthouse comes from Rochdale shops, yet over three quarters of Lighthouse clients are locals. Cash donations are also understandably reduced. The Lighthouse has been moved by the generosity of its supporters: anonymous donors, those on modest incomes who know what it's like to struggle, the grants given by town and borough councils.

All help counts and every penny goes towards the service which is provided entirely by volunteers. Donations and new volunteers are always sought after and welcomed. The more they have, the more people they can help.



CARING FOR THE COUNTRYSIDE - WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL

We need to bring to everyone's attention the devastating impact dog worrying has had on our local farmers and graziers this year.

We would like to reiterate our message from the summer issue of Whitworth Valley News. The CRoW Act 2000 states that ALL DOG WALKERS must keep their dogs on a short lead of 2 metres between the 1st of March and 31st of July and at ALL TIMES in the vicinity of livestock throughout the year. Whether you believe your dog would or would not worry livestock the law clearly states that ALL dogs must be kept on a lead when in the vicinity of livestock, no exceptions.



When a dog or dogs attacks an ewe or lamb it is the most horrific sight imaginable. The fear and pain the animals go through are unimaginable and for a farmer to come along and see the aftermath is unbearable.

There has never been so much disturbance of livestock, maiming and killing of animals in our local area and it is all preventable, by simply ensuring that dog ownership is always responsible where livestock are grazing and complying fully with the CRoW Act 2000.
