We have been contacted by a number of people about Power of Attorney applications recently and would like to take the opportunity to advise Whitworth residents that we can only execute a Power of Attorney document whilst all of the people involved have mental capacity. Once a person has lost mental capacity, and cannot understand the process of applying for a Power of Attorney, it is then too late to do it. Our fees for doing a Power of Attorney and registering it, are £225 plus VAT and the registration fee of £110.

Please note that in order to become an attorney or deputy for a family member or friend who has already lost the mental capacity to make their own decisions, an application to the Court of Protection would need to be undertaken which is very expensive with costs of sometimes over £1,000.

Our prices for Wills have remained the same as when we first began trading in 2008, which is £60 plus VAT for a single Will or £100 plus VAT for a couple making similar Wills.



### SHOP LOCAL FOOD AND CRAFT MARKET

Whitworth Shop Local Food and Craft Market is based at Hallfold Church from 10am-3:30pm on the second Saturday of every month. The Market was set up two years ago by voluntary members of the Whitworth community. The Market is a not-forprofit organisation, meaning every penny that it generates by the hiring out of stalls goes into four things: insurance, building hire, advertising and back into the local community.

This year, the Market asked for ten Whitworth based charity, or non-funded, organisations to be nominated by the attendees of the Market to receive £100. Boxes with the organisations names were made, where people could purchase tokens to put into them as well as attendees receiving extra tokens if they purchased from the stalls.

After three months of voting, the top five organisations resulted as Whitworth Brownies & Guides, Whitworth After School Club, Whitworth Vale and Healey Youth Band, Whitworth Choir and Keep Whitworth Tidy Group. A representative from each organisation was presented with a cheque for £100 on Saturday 9th July 2016 from The Committee (Lynn & Ian Knight, Karl Burrill and Naomi Kenyon).

### A BRIGHT NEW OUTLOOK AS WHITWORTH HOSPICE SHOP OPENS AFTER REFURBISHMENT

The reopening of Springhill Hospice's Whitworth shop on Market Street was eagerly awaited by customers in June, keen to see the new and improved facilities.

The official ribbon cutting ceremony was performed by the Mayor of Whitworth, Councillor Madeline De Souza, witnessed by Springhill Hospice's Chief Executive, Julie Halliwell and Income Services Manager, Sarah Ford. Declaring the shop open, Councillor De Souza paid tribute to the work of the four hundred and more volunteers who support Mayor of Whitworth cuts the ribbon left to right, Sarah Ford, the work of the Hospice. "They make such a valuable contribution and save the Hospice around half a million pounds a year," she said. "Shops

such as the one here in Whitworth could not stay open without them and we really must applaud and congratulate the work they do in helping to support the wonderful service that Springhill Hospice provides."

Customers were welcomed to a Bucks Fizz reception to celebrate the reopening of the shop which had closed for two weeks while the work took place. The bright new fascia and complete refitting of the shop inside, with new lighting, carpet, display areas and changing facilities, was declared a huge success with one regular shopper admitting to 'withdrawal symptoms' from its closure.

"We have been able to greatly improve the look and feel of the shop itself to create a much more pleasant shopping experience for our customers." said the Hospice's Sarah Ford. "Significant works have also been carried out to modernise the building itself, replacing the stairs, improving access to the upstairs storage areas and providing much needed welfare facilities for staff and volunteers."

The Whitworth shop is open Monday to Friday 9.30am to 4.30pm and Saturday morning to 12.30pm and donations of clothes, bric a brac etc are welcomed. 

### THE RIVERSIDE CELEBRATES 10 YEARS!

At the end of October this year The Riverside are to celebrate their 10th Anniversary of the opening of this building. There will be a weekend of exciting activities starting with "Stars in your Eyes" on the Friday 28th, a celebration dinner and cabaret on Saturday 29th and culminating in a family Halloween party on Sunday 30th.

There are many people now living in Whitworth who are unaware of how CLAW came into being and many of the population who have forgotten our beginnings and just take the Riverside and The Leisure Centre for granted. Just to remind you, they started in 2002 as a group of people who were determined to re-open the swimming pool after Rossendale Borough Council closed it down. They formed a limited company and managed to get charitable status and were able to start work on a very dilapidated building. A fund raising committee was also formed and they worked hard to bring in the money to pay for upgrading both the building and the plant and machinery. Many local people came along to help; electricians, plumbers, tilers etc. and many who were willing to wield a paintbrush or help with the cleaning – all volunteers. They also managed to convert the old sauna and steam room into a gym, which is still very popular. The grand reopening took place in June 2003. There have been many trials and tribulations but they have achieved the virtually impossible by keeping this facility open for 13 years and they are continually making improvements.

Within a few months of the Leisure Centre opening disaster struck as the old Civic Hall burned to the ground. The fight, led by CLAW, began with RBC who wanted to build houses on the site. However, the passionate feelings of the community were eventually listened to and this lovely building was erected with the proviso that CLAW should run the function suite and it finally opened in October 2006.

The board of Trustees appreciate the hard work and loyalty shown by the staff at both facilities and they are sure that you will agree both facilities are a credit to Whitworth.

On hearing in May, that Lancashire County Council had earmarked Whitworth Library for closure, The Friends of Whitworth Library immediately distributed petitions in local venues to save the library. The aim was to present a dossier including nearly 4000 signatures, library users' testimonials, schoolchildren's library-themed work, photos of the

library's usage and press cuttings to Jennifer Mein, leader of Lancashire County Council. So much was gathered, including superb schools' work, that this resulted in two dossiers being presented by Emmerdale's Meg Johnson to Ms Mein at the library Open Day on July 16.

A Pre-loved Book Sale, with over 1000 books donated by local residents, took place at the Co-op on 9 July to help fund the event which hosted a face-painter, balloon-modeller, storytime sessions, talks by a local artist, historian and poet and the regular groups of Scrabblers, Knit 'n' Natterers, and exercisers. A raffle, to which many local businesses generously donated 37 prizes, was also organised. Both events demonstrated local people rallying together to support the library and Ms Mein commented on the strength of the community spirit she felt during her visit.

At the time of writing, the FoWLG awaits further news from Lancashire County Council at the end of the consultation period on August 14.





### WHITWORTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

A recent donation to the museum piqued interest. A dark brown teapot with added white clay and painted flowers bearing the name "Mary Shepherd, Facit 1882". This was because we already had two similar teapots. Mary could be the daughter of Thomas Shepherd, born in Belper who married James Mellor in 1885. The oldest teapot "Mary Dearden, Millgate 1878" is guite likely to be Mary Howarth who married Daniel Dearden. She died 3 years later and is buried in Whitworth Cemetery. The largest pot "Mrs S J Shorrocks, Brickfield 1882" has proved impossible to research. Brickfield is an area of Bacup but there is no sign of anyone with the name Shorrocks.



Research on the teapots themselves proved easier. They were produced in Church Gresley between the late 1860's and 1914. Ann Bonas sold them from her shop in Measham and so they became known as Measham

or barge ware. People who passed by on the Ashby canal placed their order and collected them when they next travelled through. The teapots became a popular gift to take home to loved ones.


Who from Whitworth was bringing souvenirs of Measham home in the 1870's and 80's? It's a mystery.
