

## LUNG HEALTH CHECKS LAUNCHED TO SAVE MORE LIVES

With one of the highest mortality rates for lung cancer in England, past and current smokers aged 55 to 74 in Rossendale are being invited by their GP to an NHS lung health check to diagnose lung cancer earlier and save more lives.

The check takes place in two stages; an initial phone assessment with a specially trained health care professional. If found to be at high risk, they are offered a low dose CT scan of the lungs for further investigation. The scanner is housed in a mobile unit and will be parked at an accessible site in Rossendale.

Lung cancer can often be caught too late as there are rarely symptoms at the earlier stages. The programme is designed to check those most at risk of developing lung cancer in order to spot signs earlier, at the stage when it's much more treatable and ultimately saving more lives. The programme estimates it will diagnose around 9,000 cancers earlier than would have been. This offers the opportunity for earlier interventions, including curative surgery, which will save people's lives.

## **RUSHCART 2022**

Organisers are looking forward to hosting the unique Whitworth Rushcart ceremony on Sunday 4th September - the full works with the Whitworth processional dance, Broom Girls clearing the way for the cart pullers and the following of guest sides rounded off by the Britannia Coconutters BUT! We need help. An input of new, younger volunteers to get involved and carry on the tradition. Some of the garland dancers were there when the Rushcart was revived in 1976 and they are getting on a bit!



For most dance sides it is a hobby, practising and performing regularly through the year. The Whitworth Rushcart dancers are purely ceremonial, they meet up before the event to run through the dance, help build the cart, dress up for the day and lead the procession then meet up for a pint afterwards- that's it for the next 12 months. It is more like turning out for the Village Fete tug of war team once a year than being committed to membership of a club.

The garland dance should be done with 16 but hasn't been since the early 90's. Now it is hard to find 8 to 10 of the original dancers who are fit enough to turn out. Six years ago some of the wives and daughters joined in to help keep numbers up so there is room for the ladies too. The broom girls, cart pullers and general helpers also need new blood so if dancing isn't your thing don't worry. ### IMPORTANT NEWS FROM YOUR ANGLICAN CHURCHES IN WHITWORTH AND FACIT

For the first time in more than 100 years, as of 1st June 2022, there will cease to be a named Vicar of Whitworth or Facit. The personal touch that we have enjoyed as a community, will sadly cease to exist. St Bartholomew's and St John's will be part of a new Rossendale Team, consisting of 9 churches and 3 full time vicars. The fine tuning of what this means for the people of Whitworth and Facit is still to be finalised.

For many years now, attendance numbers have drastically fallen and with this comes the inevitable decrease in income. Each parish is completely self-funding and receives no monies from either the Government or the Church of England. Church is not seen as an integral part of life these days and the sad time has come when cuts have had to be made. If a church is not supported by its community, it is not sustainable in its present form.

From 1st June 2022, if you would like to book a Baptism or Marriage service or wish to speak to a member of the clergy, contact details for both churches are on achurchnearyou. com. Services for funerals are arranged through your chosen Funeral Director.

## **CARING FOR THE COUNTRYSIDE - WHITWORTH TOWN COUNCIL**

We are well into the season of lambing, calving and foaling and those of us who roam the local moors will be well aware of the season we are in and perhaps the issues that have concerned local graziers and farmers for many years, namely the worrying of sheep.

The CRoW Act 2000 states that ALL DOG WALKERS must keep their dogs on a short lead of 2 metres between the 1st March and 31st of July and at ALL TIMES in the vicinity of livestock throughout the year. To protect livestock and ground nesting birds, lapwing, curlew, merlin and snipe, graziers have the RIGHT in LAW to close the high ground entirely.

There have been a number of very sad and preventable incidents involving ewes and lambs so far this year, caused by dogs off their leads and worrying sheep and their lambs on the local moors. One particular farmer has lost a couple of pregnant ewes already due to worrying by dogs off their leads. These poor, defenceless animals were in a dreadful, bloody state which resulted in the humane destruction of the pregnant ewes. Between Christmas and February last year, the same farmer lost a total of 24 ewes due to dog worrying. Besides the egregious act of sheep worrying, graziers are having to deal with the separation of ewes from their lambs, caused solely by dogs off their lead and running wildly on the moors in the vicinity of them. This is incredibly distressing and damaging to both animals.

There has never been so much disturbance of livestock, maiming and killing of animals and it is all preventable, by simply ensuring that dog ownership is always responsible where livestock are grazing and complying fully with the CRoW Act 2000. Please see the Manchester Evening News for graphic and disturbing photographs of sheep that have been worried recently.

## WHITWORTH MUSEUM - FAMILY HISTORY WORKSHOP

Over the past few years, there has been a great deal of interest in family history research. Although there are many online tools available to assist the process, they can often be confusing and, all too frequently, lead to a result that is either wrong or unsatisfactory. Specialist staff at Whitworth Museum have, over the years, developed an impressive level of skill in this subject and are keen to share their knowledge and make available some of the unique resources from the museum's archive to those interested in learning more about this fascinating subject.



Anyone with an interest in this subject, regardless of where the family is thought to originate, is invited to a *Family History Workshop* which will be held at Whitworth Museum on Sunday, 19th June 2022. Numbers are limited so it is advisable to book beforehand. The session will run from 9.30am until 1.00pm and the entrance fee of £5 will include light refreshments. 

There is a Physician Associate (Reece), Advanced Nurse Practitioner (Michelle), MSK (Musculoskeletal healthcare professional) and Student Doctors as well as a Pharmacist (Anam) who can undertake medication reviews. It is hoped that appointments with these professionals will free up GP resources and provide greater all round care for the Whitworth community.

The Online Services are a great alternative to ringing or visiting the surgery, these are accessible via Patient Access. These online services include book, check or cancel appointments with a GP, nurse, or other healthcare professional, order repeat prescriptions, see parts of your health record, including information about medicines, vaccinations, and test results and to also see communications between your GP surgery and other services, such as hospitals.


The Crafternoons will be continuing into the summer term where staff are hoping to enhance learning even more with fun and exciting ideas that support their school curriculum.

Before and during the pandemic, he demonstrated community spirit and managed several fundraising projects in aid of Rochdale Children's Moorland Home, Guide Dogs UK, Royal British Legion poppy appeal and Syke 40th Rochdale Scout Group.

If that isn't enough, he is also a member of Whitworth Vale and Healey Band, Syke Explorers, currently undertaking the Duke of Edinburgh Award and even a Beaver leader.



## MAYOR'S OVERVIEW Cllr Maureen Jones, Mayor of Whitworth 2021 - 2022

This has been a very strange year for me, as Mayor and although the world has opened up again, I have attended fewer events than previous Mayors have done. I have noticed an upturn recently though and expect a much busier year for Councillor Janet Whitehead who takes over the reigns as Mayor on Thursday 19th May 2022.

I have hugely enjoyed chairing the meetings of the town council. I want to thank members of the public who have attended our meetings too. I really hope residents will continue to attend our meetings and get involved with the Town Council in future.

#### **INITIATIVES**

The Council is supported by **Town Clerk** Melanie Hearn, and **Town Caretaker** Glen Iliff. The council also contracts a **Parish Lengthsman**, Derrick Jones, who is new in post this year, for general repairs and maintenance. All three maintain healthy attendance sheets.

The Town Council sponsors the **Whitworth community police car** which has proved invaluable to the local constabulary. A competitive lease has been negotiated along with a partial sponsorship deal seeing RRG Rochdale contribute £500 per year.

The Town Council's **website**, www.whitworth.gov.uk, is well a used asset to the Council as a one-stop-shop of Whitworth information for residents and visitors. The Town Council-produced quarterly **Whitworth Valley News** magazine continues to be a very popular read.

The Town Council works in partnership with Rossendale and Lancashire Councils and other local organisations including Lancashire Police and Together Housing to provide the best possible services for the Whitworth community. To give examples, the Town Council facilitates monthly **Multi-Agency meetings**, where representatives of all the main agencies come together to tackle issues in the town.

The **Town Council's Tourism and Leisure Committee** organises a large number of events annually. The Committee is currently working on 'Queen for the Queen'

alongside the Ashcroft. A jubilee family fun party, as well as looking forward to hosting the Rushcart again for the first time in 3 years. Additionally, the Town Council itself is responsible for organising Whitworth's Remembrance Sunday commemorations. All these events serve to preserve and strengthen the town's identity and provide a solid sense of community and civic pride.

Whitworth Sports Council have produced a successful set of walk leaflets to support people as they explore what Whitworth has to offer. In addition, they are pleased to have eventually been able to run the popular skyline walk again this year and are looking forward to the Sports Festival in June.

Whitworth in Bloom managed to put on a blooming fantastic display to cheer Whitworth up. The 2021 projects included planting a new **beasties B&B** wildlife haven on Cowm Park Way North and the group supported the Welcome Back Fund initiative to cover the town with **hanging baskets**. They developed the **community orchard** area at Healey corner, added a beautiful **fountain planter** and further developed the **public toilets**. All these activities contributed to a well deserved silver gilt medal in the North West in Bloom competition.



Whitworth has been twinned with Kandel for 54 years and the friendship between the towns continues. Cllrs Aldred and Jim Mellor are instrumental in keeping the twinning alive, and thanks are due to them for their continued work; if you wish to get involved with **Town Twinning** in Whitworth please contact them.

As a statutory **planning** consultee, the Town Council passes comments on all Whitworth applications; Rossendale Borough Council then takes these observations into account when reaching planning decisions. Since April 2021, 44 applications have been considered by the Town Council, ranging from home extensions to new developments.

## CONCLUSION

Whitworth Town Council continues to work to the best of its ability to serve its community. The Town Council strives to be as accessible as possible, with the magazine and website facilitating communications to the community, and social media and the availability of the town clerk and councillors, along with the public council meetings, enabling a two-way communication with residents, organisations and businesses.

The Town Council works with local organisations and authorities to improve its offer and to enhance the lives of everyone in Whitworth, and to ensure that any issues or problems are monitored and dealt with swiftly. On a lighter note, the Town Council continues to provide and support a range of fun, family events and initiatives throughout the year, encouraging community spirit and togetherness. There will, as always, be challenges and opportunities presented over the year ahead, but the Town Council is well equipped to deal with both.




