MESSAGE IN A BOX EMERGENCY INFORMATION SCHEME

Message in a Box is a simple idea - you keep a box in your fridge containing details of your illnesses or ailments, so the emergency services, alerted to the box through stickers on your front door and fridge, can quickly identify you and your medical history and treat you accordingly. The form includes space for personal, allergy and medication details, plus contact details for your GP and carers or next of kin.



The scheme is managed and promoted by East Lancashire NHS, Age UK Lancashire and BCU Savings and Loans, and sponsored by the Rotary Club of Bacup. Boxes are available free of charge from the Whitworth Town Council office, Nuttall's Chemist and Sunnybank Day Centre. Initially, boxes will be made available to older people living on their own, but anyone who is vulnerable can be included in the scheme. WHITWORTH SPORTS FESTIVAL REPORT

The 2015 Whitworth Sports Festival perhaps started slowly, with the cancellation of a family-and-friends football event that had been a real success in 2014, but the other 26 events prospered nicely. 120 young runners contested the junior fell race; there was a record entry of 55 for the Sunday-at-dawn torture known as Splash & Dash; and two non-competitive events, Jenny Fallon's Pony-Go-Round and the High School's climbing wall, proved popular. Rebound and Boccia, two events for disabled athletes (though boccia is a sport open to anyone of any age), were notable for the pleasure derived by the participants, which is what the Sports Festival is primarily about. Carl Ashworth was awarded the Ian Clegg trophy: this too was largely about participation, although the clincher was the fact that Carl left his comfort zone, entered and won the pool tournament at the Whitworth Young People's Centre. There were inter-primary school competitions in four different sports, all won by Thorn School from Bacup, whose sporting demeanour was as praiseworthy as their athletic ability. Many thanks are due to all the valley's schools (their teachers' commitment was fantastic) and to the staff at the Leisure Centre, who did a grand job with an array of entry forms. 
FOSTERING – COULD IT BE THE ROLE FOR YOU?

CEMETERY LODGE TENANTS SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT

Although set within the boundary of the grounds of Whitworth Cemetery, the Lodge building (the large building just inside the main Cemetery gates) is actually tenanted as a residence; it is rented out by the Town Council to a family which has lived there for many years. Despite numerous signs explaining that the tenants have nothing to do with the management or maintenance of the Cemetery grounds, they are regularly confronted by members of the public with queries. Most people are pleasant and apologise for the misunderstanding, however some have been rude and even aggressive, upsetting and frustrating the tenants. They have asked if residents could be made aware, through this magazine, that they have no connections, responsibilities or sway in relation to the Cemetery grounds and would refer the public to the signage just inside the main entrance, on the grassed banking, for Cemetery information.

HELP LIGHT UP WHITWORTH AT CHRISTMAS



The Buy a Christmas Bulb campaign has been running for around 6 months now. The response has been reasonable but there's still time to donate if you wish. The idea behind the campaign is to try and expand the Christmas lights offer beyond the locality of the Riverside and extend it, as best we can, to include lights at either end of the town. Just to give you an idea of the kinds of costs involved: to purchase, install and maintain a street lighting column display, the cost is around £350. To purchase lights enough to replace one of the trees in the Memorial Gardens, the cost is around £2,400 per tree

(update: the Town Council and Rossendale Borough Council are each committing to this spend this year). To provide a Christmas tree at either end of the town, an idea the Tourism and Leisure Committee is working on as we speak, the costs look to be around £1000 - this involves the initial cost of linking up a power supply and the tree and lights purchase. As you can see, it ain't cheap! If you can spare a fiver towards the cost of the lights, it could help to make a significant impact at Christmas. SECOND RIVERSIDE BLOOD DONATION EVENT SCHEDULED

FUNDING OPPORTUNITY FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES

Rochdale Ancient Parish Educational Trust offers grants for educational purposes. Applicants for grants from the Trust need to reside in the area of the Ancient Parish of Rochdale (which includes the whole of Whitworth), or attend (or have attended) a school in the Ancient Parish of Rochdale area. There is no age limit for applicants, although preference will be given to persons qualified who are under the age of 25 years. Trust grants may be given for any purpose which promotes the education of the applicant (including social and physical training). In particular, monies may be given for the following purposes:

- Scholarships, bursaries, grants or maintenance allowances tenable at any school, University, College or Education or other institution of further or higher (including professional and technical) education approved by the Trustees;
- Scholarships or maintenance allowances to enable such persons to travel, whether in the United Kingdom or abroad to pursue their education;
- To provide financial assistance, outfits, clothing, tools, instruments or books to enable such persons to prepare for, or to assist their entry into a profession, trade or calling.



WHITWORTH TOURISM & LEISURE COMMITTEE PRODUCES TOWN VISITOR GUIDE


Visitors to Whitworth can now download a copy of the inaugural Whitworth Visitor Guide, developed and produced by the Whitworth Tourism & Leisure Committee. BUILDING PRESERVATION TRUST TO BE SET UP TO PROTECT ROSSENDALE'S HERITAGE

A Rossendale group has been awarded £9,900 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to establish a Building Preservation Trust (BPT) to rescue empty and decaying historic and listed buildings in Rossendale. 

PEOPLE OF WHITWORTH - ROSSENDALE BOROUGH COUNCIL WANTS YOUR VIEWS ON FINDING NEW DEVELOPMENT SITES

Rossendale Council is asking for comments on proposed sites for future development, as part of a major public consultation. The Local Plan (Part 2) identifies sites which meet the Borough's development needs over the next 10 years (about 250 homes to be built annually in Rossendale and an additional 20ha of employment land). Identified sites take into account protecting the landscape, habitats, encouraging nature, recreational activities and maintaining or increasing the quality of life, and the Borough Council is asking for comments on the proposed sites, and for ideas for other potential sites. Land is also being identified for protection and changes are being proposed to the existing Green Belt and Urban Boundary. Council Leader, Alyson Barnes, says, "This is your opportunity to help determine where new development will take place within Rossendale. We cannot say we don't want or need new development. Under the Government's Planning rules, if we don't identify where new development can go, the opportunity for local decision-making may be lost." Consultation closes 5pm, Monday 7 September 2015.
